
# **GAC Meeting Overview**

Each GAC Meeting usually takes place in conjunction with an ICANN Public Meeting. ICANN org utilizes a "hybrid" meeting format where ICANN community attendees have the opportunity to meet face-to-face at the meeting site (subject to local health and safety protocols) or to follow sessions remotely/virtually. ICANN82 will, once again, fully employ this hybrid meeting format.


# ICANN82 Meeting "Prep" Week

An integral part of ICANN Public Meeting preparations is known as "Prep Week" - which takes place approximately two weeks prior to the meeting. During Prep Week, ICANN org staff conduct a variety of webinar briefings designed to enable interested parties to obtain background information, receive topical issue updates and learn more about the general work of the ICANN community since the previous public meeting. 
- Click Sign up and enter your information (email address and create password)
- Once you "Join Event", the schedule shows up with blank radial buttons to the left of each session. Hover over the radial button and click "ADD TO MY SCHEDULE" (see screenshot below) or just click to add the checkmark.




• Once you've selected all sessions, click the My Schedule link in the lower left corner or hover over your profile and select My Schedule.

• In the bottom section, "Export Calendar", click the link next to "My Schedule". When the .ics is exported, add it to the appropriate calendar.

### Calendar Sync for Google Calendar, Outlook & Apple Calendar

Subscribe in your calendar program to see this event alongside your meetings.

#### Apple Calendar

- 1. Choose a calendar to sync: My Schedule or Full Event Schedule
- 2. On next screen, set "Auto-refresh" to "Every hour" to ensure you get schedule changes.

#### Google Calendar

Choose a calendar to sync: My Schedule or Full Event Schedule.
 Note: Google will only update the feed once per day, which means you could miss out on last minute updates.




#### Microsoft Outlook

- 1. Choose a calendar to sync: My Schedule or Full Event Schedule
- 2. View instructions for Outlook.com or Outlook for Mac.

#### **Export Calendar**

This is a one-time export. You will not receive any updates to the schedule. If you expect the schedule to change, you should choose to one of the sync options above.


# **GAC Meeting Agenda – Navigating the Meeting Calendar Page**

Please make sure you are logged-in to the GAC website with your ICANN Account access credentials to make full use of the public and GAC-private contents of the page.

In developing the agenda for ICANN82, the GAC leadership has worked hard to avoid session conflicts to enable GAC members to attend cross-community sessions and other sessions of interest during the public meeting. As a consequence, in addition to showing all the GAC sessions for the week, the GAC website ICANN82 calendar page includes references to other notable ICANN82 community sessions that may be of interest to GAC members.



Once you have accessed the ICANN82 hybrid meeting agenda page, click on any session you want to know more about. For example ICANN82 – Session 3 - GAC Opening Plenary on Saturday 8 March from 21:15 to 22:30 UTC

Please note that all session times are displayed in UTC, whereas the local/on-site time of the meeting is Pacific Standard Time (UTC-8).

USA Daylight Savings Time - A local clock "reset" will happen on the second day of the meeting (Sunday, 9 March 2025), from that day, the local/on-site time of the meeting will change to UTC-7.

#### Session Details:

When you reach a session page, you will find all the necessary information about the session and you will have access to any materials prepared for the session as they are created and published, including:

- Session details (date/time/title)
- Remote participation link (a Zoom Web Conference Link will be provided shortly before (the previous day) the session is held)
- Real Time Transcription link
- Briefing documents will be posted under the *Material* section at the bottom of the session page
- Presentation Slides for each session will also be posted under the *Material* section
- Links to session recordings and transcript published after the public meeting concludes

You may also find the pdf agenda version of the GAC schedule useful (<a href="https://gac.icann.org/dA/de11ecd72b/icann82-gac-schedule.pdf?language\_id=1">https://gac.icann.org/dA/de11ecd72b/icann82-gac-schedule.pdf?language\_id=1</a>) as it identifies all GAC sessions for the meeting week on a single-page document. Sessions are color-coded as indicated in the "legend" at the bottom of the document. As noted above, in addition to the GAC plenary sessions, the agenda also identifies other sessions of

interest during the week. In-person attendees have found it helpful to print out a copy of the agenda to bring with them to the meeting or to download a copy on their mobile phone.

Please note that at past GAC face-to-face public meetings, in rare instances, the meeting agenda has had to be updated to reflect real-time changes during the meeting week. That is also possible for this hybrid meeting. As necessary, throughout the week, GAC Support will generate updated versions of the agenda to reflect any changes that may take place. Staff will notify GAC participants of any schedule changes via email as soon as possible.

# **Keeping Time - Meeting Time Zones**

All times in the GAC agenda/schedule are listed as UTC.

Please note that ICANN82 official meeting hours for sessions are scheduled from 09:00 to 17:30 standard time in Seattle, United States of America (UTC-8). A USA Daylight Savings Time reset will happen on the second day of the meeting (Sunday, 9 March 2025). From that day, the local/on-site time of the meeting will change to UTC-7. Dedicated session times during that business-hours window are being used for the official meeting schedule.

Full ICANN org meeting support (interpretation and real time transcription) can only be made available to the community during those business hours.

# **Registration for ICANN82**

Attendance at an ICANN Public Meeting is free to all ICANN community members and the general public.

For ICANN82, the ICANN org is requiring that ALL meeting participants officially register in advance of the meeting in order to ensure accurate numbers for logistical (i.e meeting room and schedule access) purposes. In person attendees must register no later than **7 March 2025.** 

For participants attending the meeting remotely, full meeting registration status is also necessary to view the full public meeting schedule.

Although formal GAC delegates will receive calendar invitations to individual GAC Meeting sessions, for your own planning purposes you are strongly encouraged to formally register for the ICANN82 meeting as early as possible.

<u>To register for the meeting you</u> will need to have an "ICANN Account". If you do not have an ICANN Account at the time you attempt to register you will be redirected to a web page that helps you to establish your account.

# **Registration for Individual Sessions**

After registering for the meeting, you should also register for individual meeting sessions throughout the week.

- 1. Registration to Confirm In-Person or Virtual Participation Registration is required for all attendees. In-person attendees MUST be pre-registered by 7 March 2025 to gain access to the meeting floors of the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Seattle.
- 2. To build your Personal Agenda from the main navigation menu, select Schedule > Simple (displays session titles only), Expanded (displays session details on the main page) Grid or By Venue > Click the checkmark ( ) next to any session title that you intend to participate in-person or virtually.

# **Connecting to GAC Sessions - Zoom Room Tool Basics**

Zoom virtual meeting rooms will be used as the technology platform for all sessions of the ICANN82 Meeting - for both in-person and virtual attendees. Most GAC delegates are already familiar with the platform, as the Zoom tool has been used during the previous ICANN public meetings and for GAC community calls.

GAC Support staff will send calendar invitations for each ICANN82 GAC session via email directly to all GAC Member and Observer organization participants. Please look for those calendar invites in your email in-box before the start of ICANN82.

Calendar invitations will include the link to the ICANN82 session web page. Participants will need to click on the link to view the connection details for each session.n.

# **Connecting to Other Community Sessions**

Please note that non-GAC cross-community sessions will utilize their own different Zoom Room links. Links to ICANN Community sessions of potential interest to GAC delegates will also be added to the individual session entries on the GAC Calendar page.

All participants are required to download the most updated version of the Zoom application to successfully connect to the GAC sessions.

After completing your meeting registration, to participate in any session, please visit the official ICANN schedule page and navigate to your chosen session. Most sessions during this meeting will utilize a standard Zoom Meeting, which allows up to 500 virtual participants to join. Features include the ability to unmute your microphone as needed, type in chat, and view documents and shared video. A handful of sessions, including the ICANN Community Forum, will operate as Zoom Webinars. These webinars are capable of accommodating more participants than a standard Zoom Meeting but have less functionality.

# **ICANN82 INFORMATION - Zoom Room Expectations and Protocols**

The ICANN82 Community Forum will be conducted as a hybrid event to accommodate both in-person and virtual attendance. ICANN is committed to ensuring an inclusive meeting that provides an equal opportunity for all to engage on important policy matters. All participants will be required to use Zoom to participate in meeting sessions and will be required to utilize the "Raise Hand" feature to enter the queue to talk (this includes in-room attendees).

To join a session's Zoom room, simply visit the official <u>ICANN meeting schedule</u> and navigate to the session of your choice. In the description, you will find the Zoom link listed under "Participation Links". ICANN org has also published a quick guide on how to use Zoom, which is available <u>here</u>. Live language interpretation will be provided in multiple languages in select sessions - including all GAC sessions. ICANN has integrated remote simultaneous interpretation (RSI) into Zoom. More information on how to use this feature is available <u>here</u>.

Note: You are encouraged to share ICANN82 session YouTube links (when available) on social media. However, to help reduce potential session disruptions, **please** <u>do not</u> share Zoom participation links on social media.

### An Equitable Experience for All

- Room Setup Improvements (with physical distancing)
  - Additional screens
  - 1:1 microphones
  - Cameras allowing virtual participants to see in-room participants
  - o Dedicated Staff Participation Managers in all on-site meeting rooms and Zoom.
- Virtual Participants Use the Zoom Microphone to speak and Zoom Video to be seen.
- On-Site Participants
  - Use a physical microphone (push to talk, wireless handheld, or podium microphone) to speak during the session. Do NOT use the Zoom Microphone to speak.

Regardless of physical location, all participants should use the "Raise Hand" feature in Zoom to join the speaking queue.



# **Joining the Zoom Room**


Attendees can join any ICANN82 Zoom room meeting using the following methods:

- Computer audio (a good USB headset is recommended)
- Call me Zoom will dial out to you on the number you provide (please remember to select the correct country code)



# **Comments/Questions during GAC Zoom Sessions**


If you wish to make a comment, ask a question or take the floor during a GAC session, you may either type "<Question>" in the chat pod of the Zoom room or raise your hand, situated in the reactions icon on the Zoom banner at the bottom of the screen under "Reactions" tab.



 Note that Zoom frequently updates its features, so you may encounter new options at any time. GAC Support staff will work to alert attendees if anything like this occurs during the meeting week.

### **Zoom Access to "Live" Session Interpretations**

As an additional Zoom room feature, the Zoom room for each GAC session enables "live" real-time interpretation in the 6 UN languages and Portuguese. This capability can be accessed from the Zoom room menu at the bottom of the Zoom screen (as shown below).



This integration allows participants who have downloaded the Zoom application, to click a single button within the Zoom meeting or webinar to access the interpretation of all available languages.

- To use the interpretation feature within Zoom, download the Zoom application.
- The language spoken in Zoom may vary throughout the session depending on who is speaking.
- Participants should select the language they will speak or listen to by clicking on the Interpretation icon located on Zoom toolbar.
  - If you wish to speak, prior to unmuting your microphone, ensure you have selected the language you will be speaking, including English speakers.
- If you are unable to download Zoom or have dialed into a session via telephone, visit the relevant session information on the schedule to find an alternate, listen-only option.

# Real Time Transcriptions (RTT)

Real-time transcription (RTT), also known as "scribing" or Live Captioning, is a feature used at every ICANN Meeting for GAC sessions. RTT will be provided for GAC sessions scheduled during the ICANN81 Meeting official times. RTT links will be provided under each GAC session on the calendar. In the case of audio difficulties, you can use the RTT feed as an alternative way to follow session activities, if absolutely necessary.

- RTT and Zoom closed captioning (CC) will be provided in English.
- If the session is being scribed by live captioners, you may also open the Scribe RTT link listed in the relevant session link/description on the ICANN82 Meeting schedule.

This access is particularly helpful to monitor more than one Zoom room at the same time. This access also provides a quick (unofficial) running transcript of a session "during" the session.

- If a particular session is not being scribed by live captioners via RTT, Zoom's automated real-time text service will be enabled.
- You can view the real-time text provided by Zoom by clicking the "CC" (closed captioning) icon on the Zoom toolbar.

Please note that the automated and live real-time text transcription might contain inaccuracies and is not an official record of the meeting. Also, real-time text might not be available for speech interpreted into other languages.

Official transcripts for all GAC sessions will be provided in English and made available in the weeks immediately after the ICANN82 meeting. If a session was supported in other languages, official transcripts in those supported languages will also be published via available web links.

### **Creating and Managing your Own ICANN Schedule**

The official ICANN82 Meeting schedule is published on the ICANN82 Meeting page at: . <a href="https://icann82.sched.com/">https://icann82.sched.com/</a> In order to find session information, you can either go to the session page or click on the Schedule - "Expanded" format in the drop down menu.

You will have the option to either click on SCHEDULE or MY SCHEDULE (bottom left banner).

### **MY SCHEDULE**

If you are fully registered for the meeting and have created your profile, you may select which sessions you wish to attend remotely and create your own personal meeting schedule. Those added sessions will appear in "My Schedule" available from the banner on the bottom left. To create your profile, please follow the steps indicated.



### **FULL SCHEDULE**

Using the "SCHEDULE" option will allow you to view the ICANN82 Meeting community schedule, day by day. Simply select the session you wish to view. Session descriptions, Zoom room links, RTT links (if provided), and additional material will be made available on each session page.

### HOW TO DOWNLOAD ICANN82 SESSION INFORMATION TO YOUR CALENDARS:

### Step 1 - Create a profile and your personalized ICANN82 schedule

Go to the <a href="https://icann82.sched.com/">https://icann82.sched.com/</a> and create a profile and login. Every session on the Full schedule can be selected and added to your individual schedule by clicking the checkmark ()) in the left corner of each meeting title. This adds it to your individual schedule, My Schedule, which you can then add to your calendar. See next step.

# Step 2 - To export your personal schedule into your calendar: once you've added all your chosen meetings to your schedule, click on (Saved to My Schedule)

- Access the schedule <a href="https://icann82.sched.com/">https://icann82.sched.com/</a>. The schedule shows up with blank radial buttons to the left of each session. Hover over the radial button and click "ADD TO MY SCHEDULE" or just click to add the checkmark (<a href="https://www.checkmark.com/">w</a>).
  - Once you've selected all sessions, click the My Schedule link in the lower left corner or hover over your profile and select My Schedule.
  - Click the Phone icon
  - In the bottom section, "Export Calendar", click the link next to "My Schedule".
    When the .ics is exported, add it to the appropriate calendar.
- Please remember, for security purposes, participation links will be posted 24-hours prior to the session start times.

**Step 3 - All remote participation sessions will use Zoom rooms.** You can find the Zoom room links for public meetings on the <a href="https://icann82.sched.com/">https://icann82.sched.com/</a>. URLs will be made available 24 hours prior to the sessions. Participants will have the ability to view the links only if they have registered.

Please download the <u>latest Zoom app</u> on your participation device (mobile or desktop computer). Need to learn or brush-up on using Zoom? Check out the Joining a <u>Zoom Meeting</u> <u>Tutorial</u>.

### Step 4 - Download the mobile app by searching for "ICANN Meetings" in your app stores.

• Please make sure you are on mute when you enter any Zoom session. Your video should be "off" by default. You can control the mute and unmute via the meeting controls.




# **Language Availability - Live Interpretation (Important)**

- All sessions that include interpretation will be conducted using the ICANN Remote Simultaneous Interpretation (RSI) platform now integrated into Zoom. You can select the language of your choice by clicking on the "Interpretation" icon on the toolbar.
- This feature is only available for participants joining via the Zoom application using computer audio.
- Click on the "Interpretation" icon on the Zoom toolbar.



• Select the desired language (English, Chinese, French, Russian, Spanish or Arabic).



- If you would like to ask a question or make a comment in one of the supported languages, raise your virtual hand on the Zoom platform.
- Select the language you will speak by clicking on the "Interpretation" icon on the toolbar.
- When called upon, unmute your microphone in Zoom. State your name for the record, the

language you will speak, and ask your question or make your comment.

- Mute notifications from all other platforms or devices.
- When you are done speaking in the Zoom session, mute your audio, and listen to the language of your choice.
- Please note that if you will be speaking a language OTHER than the language you are listening to, you must change your selection each time you speak to ensure interpretation can be heard by other participants.
- In the event a speaker does not select their language channel, they may still be heard by selecting: **Unmute Original Audio**.

# Tips to Make the Most of a Hybrid Meeting

- Consider using a headset if you are planning to speak during a session. Headsets often have better microphones and sound quality than the built-in microphones and speakers in your laptop or mobile phone.
- State your name and affiliation for the record before you make your comment. Speak clearly, directly, and slowly. If you are reading a statement or a document, please pause between sentences.
- ICANN is a global community and different cultures have different communication styles. Without the benefit of facial expressions and body language, misunderstanding can occur. Please try to be succinct when interacting virtually to avoid miscommunications.
- Please be aware that all ICANN Public Meeting sessions are subject to ICANN's <u>Expected</u> <u>Standards of Behavior</u> and the <u>ICANN Community AntiHarassmentPolicy</u>.
- You are encouraged to stay connected with ICANN org after the meeting through news updates and regional newsletters. <u>Sign up here</u>.
