Why Are Our .AMAZON Applications So Important to Us?

We are committed to the new gTLD program

Innovate for our customers

 Stable and secure foundation for communication and e-commerce

 Signal authenticity and security to customers





.AMAZON Met the Applicant Guidebook Requirements

- Applications received perfect scores from ICANN
- ICANN's Geographic Names Panel determined 3 times that "amazon" is not a geographic name that requires governmental approval
- An Italian legal scholar and IP expert dismissed the Community Objection filed by the ICANN-selected Independent Objector
- A French legal expert commissioned by ICANN found governments had no legal right to the name "amazon"



We Have Worked Within the Multistakeholder Model

Sought dialogue and compromise:

- Met with ICANN several times to discuss practical compromise solutions (2013-2017)
- Met in Brasilia with representatives of Brazil, Peru, and other OTCA member countries to propose compromise solutions (2013)
- Committed publicly to a proposed Public Interest Commitment (2013)
- Requested to meet with the GAC (2013-2017)

Worked within ICANN's community-developed rules:

- Filed Reconsideration Requests (2013)
- Consulted with the Ombudsman (2014)
- Participated in Cooperative Engagement Process (2014-2016)
- Initiated the Independent Review Process (2016)



The IRP Final Declaration

 The IRP Panel unanimously declared that the Board violated ICANN's Articles, Bylaws, and Guidebook

 The Board has an obligation to make an objective and independent judgment – and it failed to do so



The IRP Panel Found the Identified Public Policy Reasons Insufficient and Without Merit

- No material harm based solely on the .AMAZON TLDs being delegated to Amazon
- One-word match (in treaty organization name) is "not likely to be misleading."
- "The legal claim of Brazil and Peru is without merit" and there are "no inherent governmental rights to geographic terms."
- "Amazon" is not a listed geographic name



Our Practical Compromise

- Public Interest Commitment
 - Incorporated into Registry Agreement
 - Concept based on 2012 GAC Advice
- Legally binding and enforceable by ICANN Compliance
 - Online complaint form
 - PIC Dispute Resolution Procedure

Block Culturally Sensitive Names at Second Level

 This means that no one could ever register and use these names

 We would consult with relevant governments to identify these terms

For example: rainforest.amazon

Ongoing Process

 Ongoing process to identify other culturally sensitive terms

 Regular consultations with relevant governments under defined procedures

- Filed or endorsed by OTCA and Member Governments
- Could include technical and application preparation support
