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GAC Meeting Overview (RH)

- GAC meetings are held three times a year in a hybrid format, allowing both on-site and remote participation
- GAC meets in conjunction with ICANN public meetings
- Over 25+ years the committee has evolved to work year-round
- Traditionally, GAC used face-to-face meetings to do its work; with limited remote "observations". Then, due to the Covid pandemic experience, meetings are now fully "hybrid"
- Meetings have become touch-points for negotiating and network opportunities
 - Opportunities for cross-community collaboration and communication
 - GAC continues to develop a Communiqué during each meeting

Key Aspects of GAC Public Meetings (RH)

- All GAC meeting sessions are open/public "hybrid" format major reliance on Zoom Room capabilities
- Meeting are intended to be as accessible as possible:
 - Real-time interpretation in 6 UN languages + Portuguese
 - Real-time captioning Remote participation
 - Recording of the meetings are kept on GAC website
- GAC Meetings are based on open dialogue and collegiality
- GAC traditionally produces a communiqué to the ICANN Board and community at the end each meeting
- The GAC Communiqué, meeting recordings and minutes, transcription and recording of all open meeting sessions are posted online after the meeting

Preparing for the Meeting (RH)

- Scheduled way in advance (goal two years lead time)
- Travel support is available to aid in planning for valuable F2F time with other GAC members
- Meeting preparations begin during the previous meeting
- Members and Observers discuss and agree on potential meeting topics prior to meetings (blend of info-sharing and decision-making/advice development)
- At least two (2) agenda-setting calls each period
- Bilateral meeting prep (ALAC, Board, GNSO) arranged
- Agenda & topical briefings are circulated and posted online in advance of the meeting

Prague, Czech Republic

The ICANN83 Policy Forum will be held in Prague, Czech Republic from Monday 9 June through Thursday 12 June 2025. The 4-day meeting will be conducted as a hybrid event to accommodate both in-person and virtual attendance. The associated GAC meeting schedule has been developed by the committee to leverage that hybrid format.

The Policy Forum will present many opportunities for government attendee discussions and deliberations with time for the committee's various policy and advice priorities, and bandwidth for attendees to participate in important cross-community endeavors. During the meeting, member representatives will continue their work on several key topics that have attracted priority attention from governments throughout the last several years. These topics will include (1) discussions regarding the program for the next round of new generic top-level domains (gTLDs); (2) registration information and data protection policies; and (3) DNS abuse mitigation measures.

GAC Communiqué at ICANN Meetings



GAC Role in ICANN - Advice to the Board (RH)

"Bylaws Section 12.2(a)(x): The advice of the Governmental Advisory Committee on public policy matters **shall be duly taken into account**, both in the formulation and adoption of policies. In the event that the Board determines to take an action that is not consistent with Governmental Advisory Committee advice, it shall so inform the Governmental Advisory Committee and state the reasons why it decided not to follow that advice.

Any Governmental Advisory Committee advice approved by a full Governmental Advisory Committee consensus, understood to mean the practice of adopting decisions by general agreement in the absence of any formal objection ("GAC Consensus Advice"), may only be rejected by a vote of no less than 60% of the Board, and the Governmental Advisory Committee and the Board will then try, in good faith and in a timely and efficient manner, to find a mutually acceptable solution. The Governmental Advisory Committee will state whether any advice it gives to the Board is GAC Consensus Advice."



GAC Communique Background and Overview (RH)

- GAC Communiqué is a traditional work product of the committee identified as a "report" in the GAC Operating Principles and produced after every ICANN public meeting
- Has evolved to serve as the primary GAC "advice" channel to the ICANN Board
- Also used by the committee as a means to identify and share views on "issues of importance" from governments to the ICANN Board and rest of the community
- New procedural elements to Communiqué preparation and approval are frequently considered and process is regularly refined.


