2. Implementation Review Team Update

Rida Tahir (Canada)

Implementation Review Team (IRT) - Recent Updates

- The IRT commenced its work in May 2023 and is expected to draft the next Applicant Guidebook (AGB) in preparation for the next round of new gTLDs.
- The GAC appointed a representative and an alternate to participate in the process, provide input to the IRT and report back to the broader committee on areas of importance to the GAC.
- GAC members appointed to the IRT are:
 - ✓ Canada (Representative)
 - ✓ UK (Alternate)
- ICANN org presented an updated [Implementation Plan](#) in September 2024 for the Implementation Review Team's input
- It is expected that the AGB will be published no later than December 2025.

Implementation Review Team (IRT) - Recent Updates

- The implementation plan currently assumes a 15-24 month timeline for drafting the Applicant Guidebook (AGB), with the support of the IRT.
- It is expected that the AGB will be published no later than December 2025.
- On 1 February 2024, the IRT posted a [first public comment proceeding](#) in a series of proceedings.
- In total, ten Public Comments were submitted by stakeholders from across the community on the proposed language for draft sections of the Next Round Applicant Guidebook (AGB).
- Submissions tended to find that the proposed language was consistent with the [Final Report on the new gTLD Subsequent Procedures \(SubPro\) Policy Development Process \[gnso.icann.org\]](#) (Final Report) outputs.

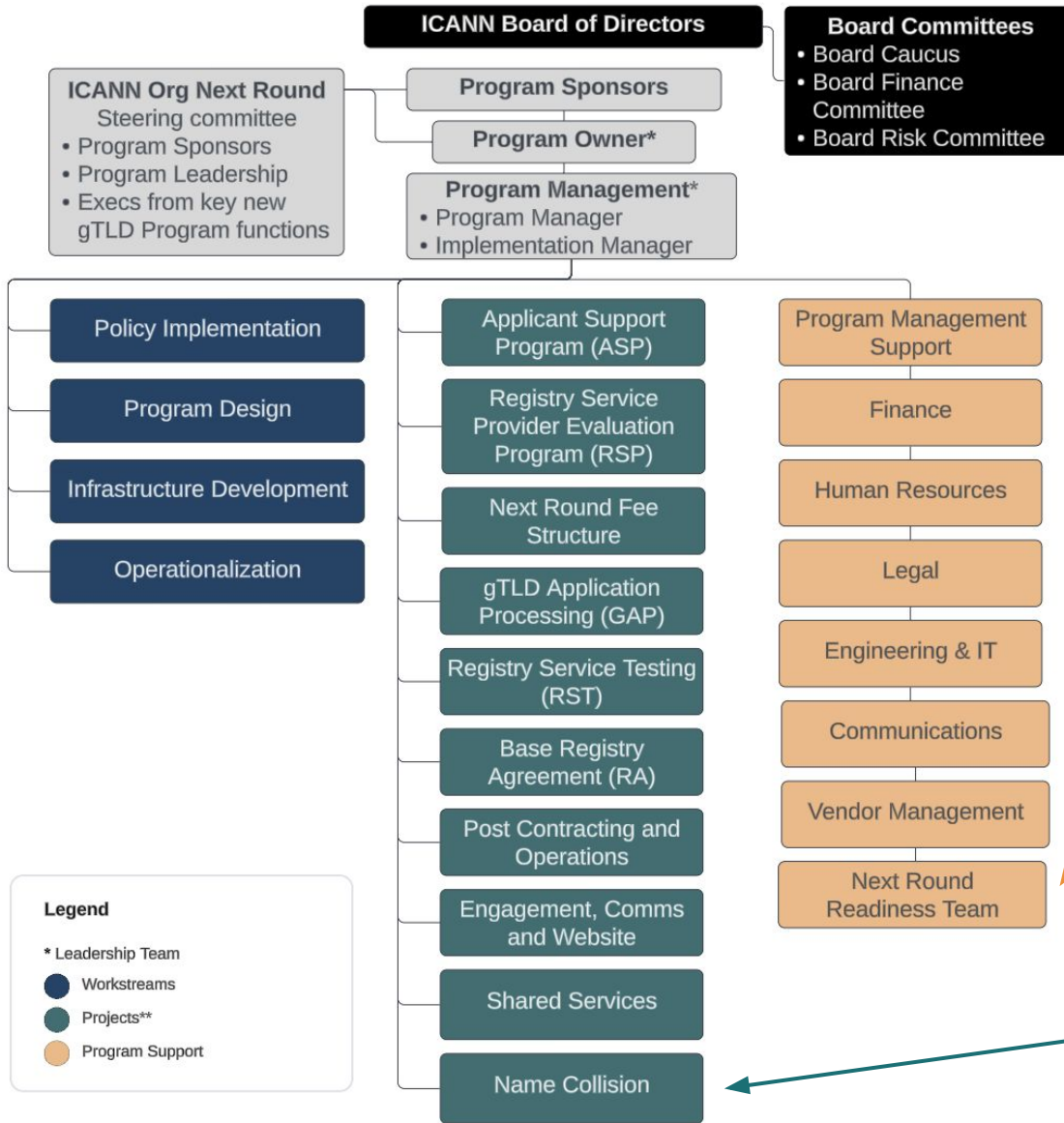
Implementation Review Team (IRT) - Recent Updates

- ICANN org conducted a [second Public Comment proceeding](#) from 10 September to 21 October.
- This is the second in a series of Public Comment proceedings seeking input from the ICANN community on proposed language for the AGB for the New gTLD Program: Next Round.
- Specifically, ICANN org is looking for input from the community on whether the proposed language is consistent with the relevant outputs from the Final Report on the New gTLD Subsequent Procedures Policy Development Process.
- The proposed language has been developed in collaboration with the [Subsequent Procedures Implementation Review Team](#).
- The GAC submitted a [collective comment](#) in support of the proposed language, finding it consistent with relevant outputs from the SubPro Final Report.

New TLD Program: Next Round - Program Organization Chart



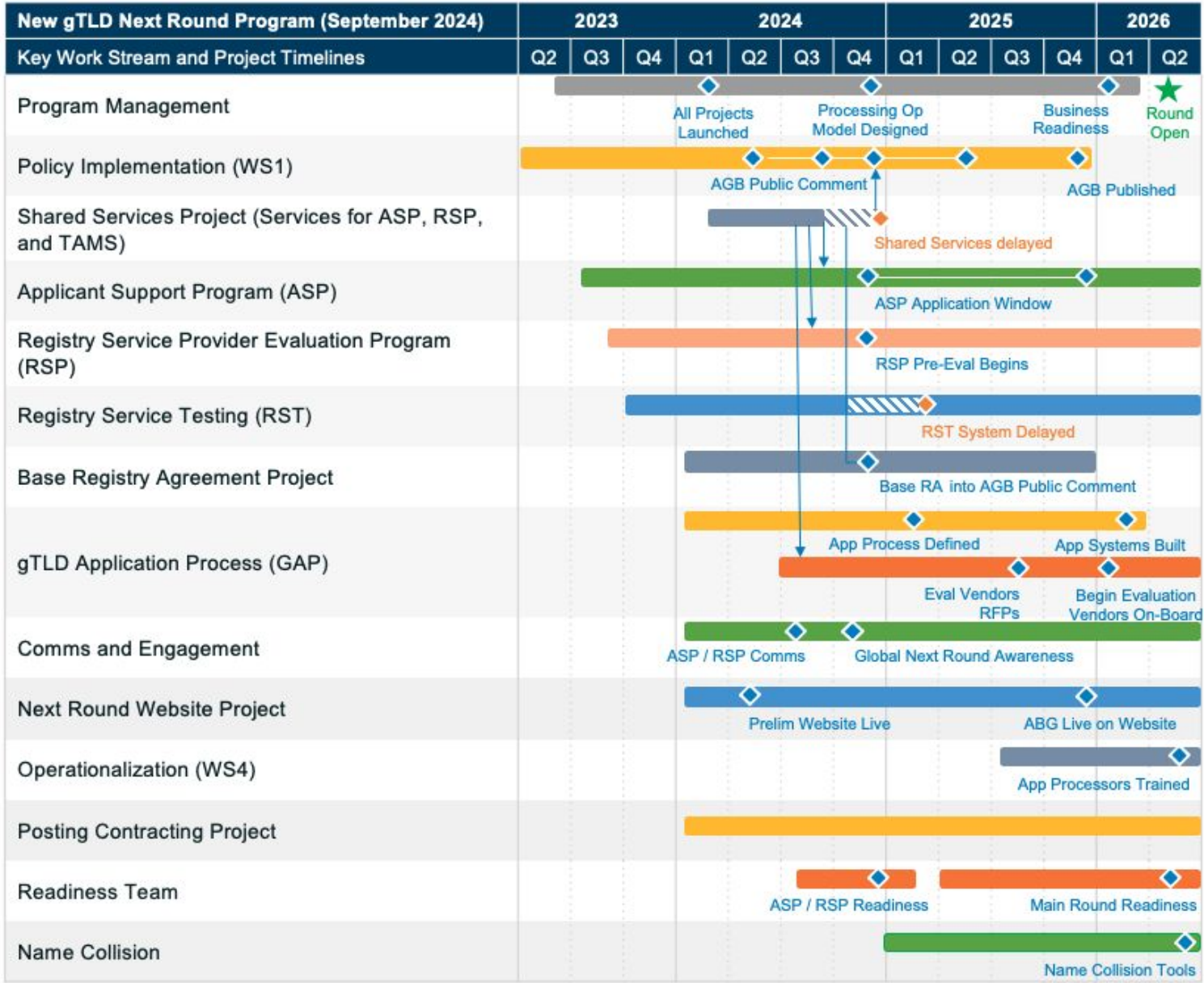
The Readiness Team was launched in July for applicant and internal ICANN organizational readiness

Registry Agreement: The base registry agreement updates continue to progress as the cross-functional team identifies changes needed to align Next Round policy requirements.



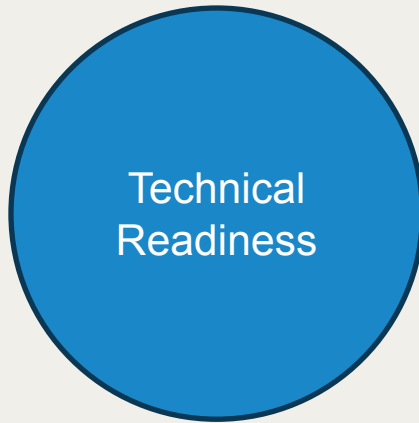
gTLD Application Processing (GAP): Scope, budget, and high-level timeline have been confirmed. The development of business requirements is in full speed, having completed more than 15+ sprints thus far. A total of 10 systems and 6 integrations to other existing systems have been identified as needing to be developed. Development work on the biggest system, the TLD Application Management System (TAMS), began in June.

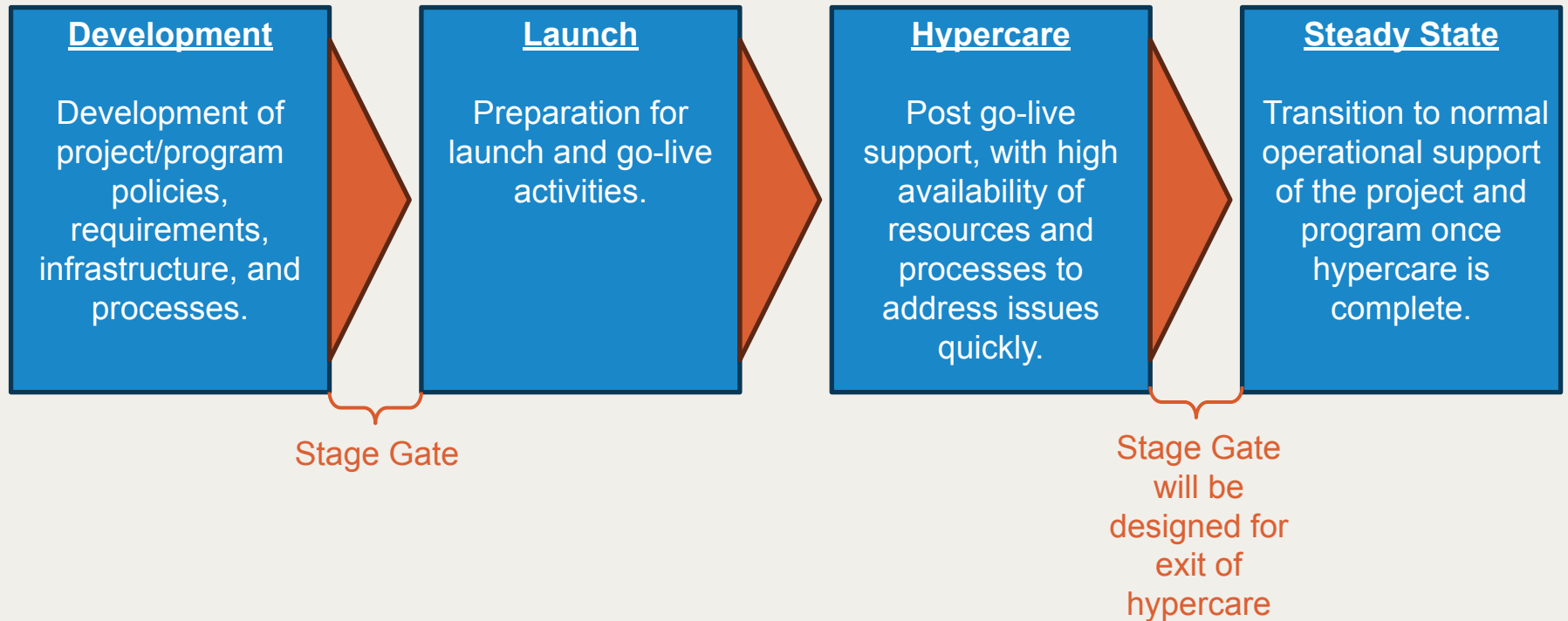
Scope of Launch and Support Approach



Purpose: Ensure ICANN org is prepared to successfully launch and support the Next Round

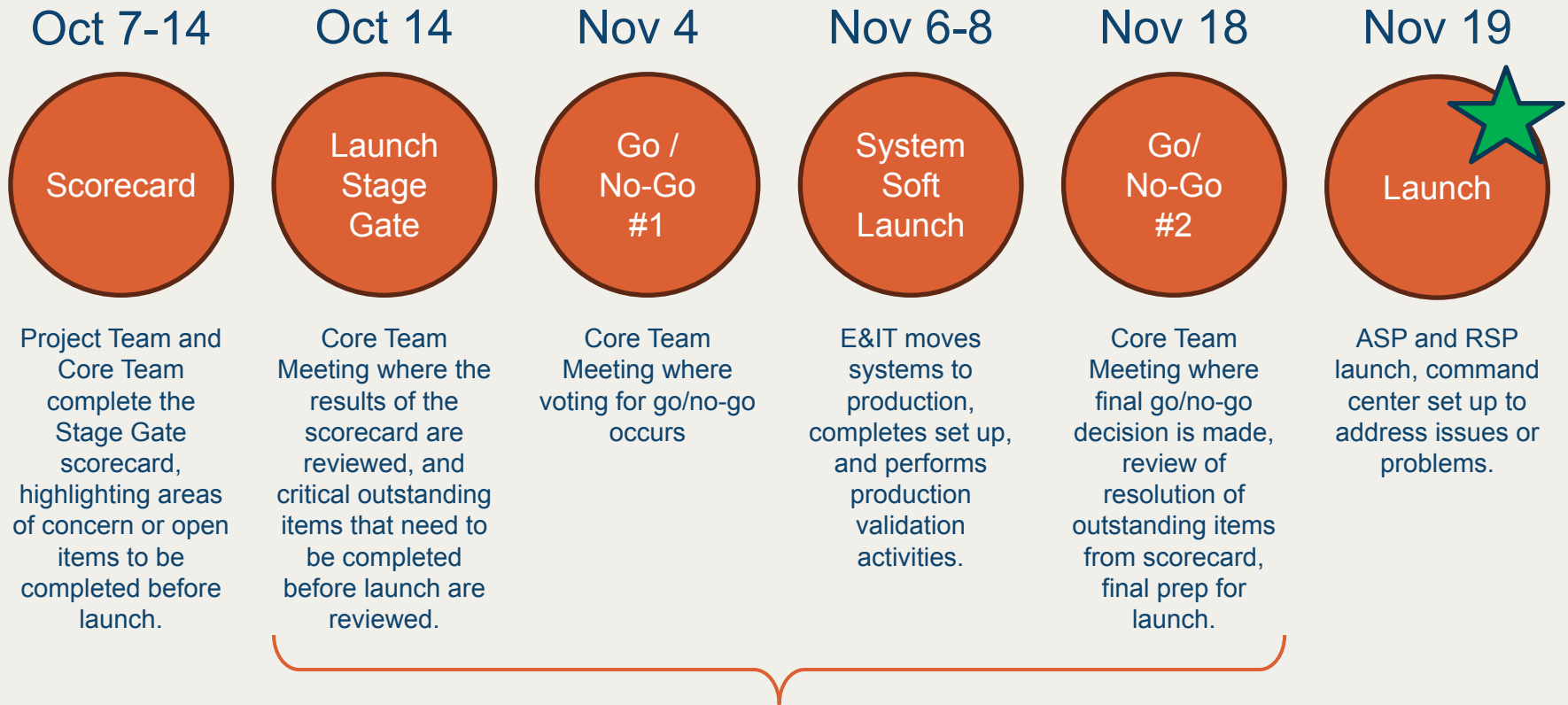
Readiness: Alignment on the activities, roles, and performance requirements needed to successfully launch and support each program.

ASP & RSP: Key Activities Stage Gate to Launch

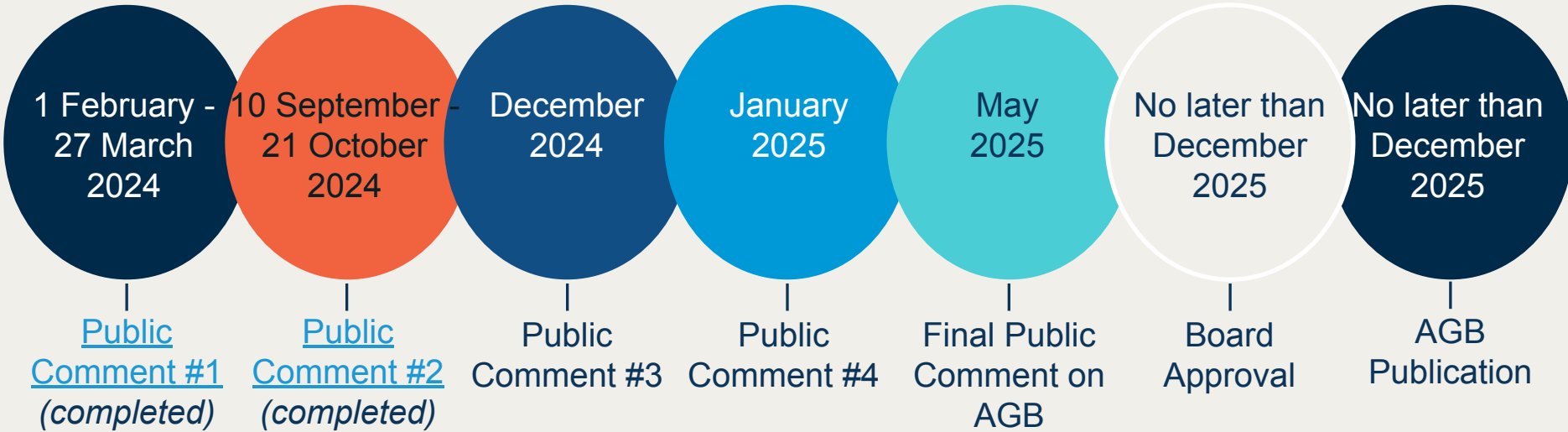

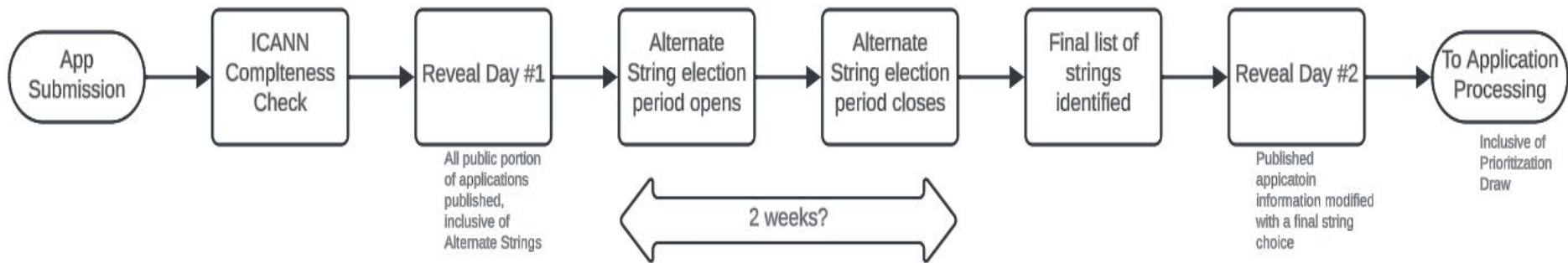

Contention Set Resolution: High-Level Flow for Alternate String



Contention Set Resolution: Indicative Flow*

1. Application Window closes.
2. Completeness check.
3. Reveal Day.
4. Opening of a 14-day “replacement window”; eligible: everyone whose alternate string is not identical to another applied for primary or alternate string.
5. If desired, applicants request to switch application to alternate string.
6. “replacement window” closes.
7. String Confirmation Day.
8. Singular/Plural Notification Period
9. String similarity review**
10. Contention sets are updated following each of singular/plural notifications, string similarity review (and objection), string confusion objection (and appeal), and CPE outcome.
11. .brands can submit request to change their string, per recommendation 20.8.
12. Auctions using ascending-clock second-price methodology.

*This is a high-level overview of the proposed flow for alternate strings / contention resolution only.

**Other reviews and evaluations may also occur in parallel.

Supplemental Recommendation 24.3 (Singular/Plural Strings)

The GNSO Council recommends **prohibiting the delegation of singulars and plurals of the same word in the same language in order to reduce the risk of end user confusion**. This prohibition applies in two distinct situations 1) where an applied-for gTLD string is a singular or plural of an existing gTLD or those Blocked Names on Annex A and 2) where an applied-for gTLD string is a singular or plural of another applied-for gTLD string:

Supplemental Recommendation 24.3 (Singular/Plural Strings)

- 1) **If ICANN org is informed by reference to a dictionary, and verifies by reference to a dictionary, that an application for a string that is the singular or plural version of the same word in the same language during the same application window, of an existing gTLD or Blocked Name has been submitted, such application will not be permitted to proceed.** ICANN org will treat all other applications for the same strings in the same manner.
- 1) If ICANN org is informed by reference to a dictionary, and verifies by reference to a dictionary, that there is an application for the singular version of a word and an application for a plural version of the same word in the same language during the same application window, the relevant applications will be placed in a contention set. ICANN org will treat all other applications for the same strings in the same manner.

Singular/Plural - Draft AGB Approach

1. Contention Requirement

- If a gTLD application includes a string that is a **singular or plural form** of another applied-for string in the **same language**, both must be placed in **contention** to avoid end-user confusion.
- Applications for strings that are singular or plural forms of existing TLDs, previously processed strings, or blocked names cannot proceed.

Singular/Plural - Draft AGB Approach

2. Notification Process

- **Eligibility:** Any party (applicants, operators, public, etc.) may notify ICANN if two applied-for strings are singular/plural forms of the same word or if an applied-for string matches the form of a delegated or blocked name.
- **Required Information:**
 - Applied-for and existing TLD string details.
 - Dictionary reference (post-1970), including ISBN, language, publisher, year, location, and specific page(s).
 - Images of dictionary ISBN, cover, imprint, and relevant word pages.

Singular/Plural - Draft AGB Approach

3. Burden of Notification

- Notifications must be submitted by notifiers; if no notification is received, the strings will proceed without contention.

4. Submission Timeline

- Notifications must be submitted within 30 days following String Confirmation Day.

5. ICANN Review and Outcome

- ICANN reviews and determines the outcome, notifying applicants and updating the application status pages.

Recent Developments on ASP Matters

- On 29 July 2024, the Board shared its [ICANN80 Kigali Communiqué Scorecard](#) on Board Action noting the need for a Board-GAC Bylaws Consultation on GAC Advice item 1.a.i pertaining to the ASP evaluation process, and item 1.a.ii pertaining to the ASP evaluation panel.
- The GAC and ICANN Board held a Bylaws Mandated Consultation Call on ICANN80 GAC Advice on [16 September 2024](#).
- This Bylaws-mandated consultation was to discuss the Board’s concerns with implementing GAC Advice on the Applicant Support Program (ASP) in its 17 June 2024 [ICANN80 Kigali Communiqué](#).
- As denoted in ICANN Bylaws section 12.2(a)(x), the purpose of the consultation call was for the GAC and Board to “try, in good faith and in a timely and efficient manner, to find a mutually acceptable solution.”

Recent Developments on ASP Matters

- On 16 September 2024, the GAC and ICANN Board held a [Consultation Call on ICANN80 GAC Advice](#).
- During this meeting, the Board presented approaches to address the GAC's concerns with a first-come, first-served ASP evaluation process. The proposed compromise for 1.a.i is:
 - ✓ *The Board will direct ICANN org to share monthly reporting with the ICANN community on the geographic distribution of ASP applications received and qualified. The Board expects that monthly reporting will be available via the Program Statistics on the ASP website and via updates to the SubPro Implementation Review Team (IRT). The monthly reporting on geographic distribution can inform quarterly adjustments to the ASP Communications, Outreach & Engagement efforts.*
 - ✓ *In addition, the Board will direct ICANN org to share results of geographic distribution with the IRT after 20 qualified ASP applicants to determine adjustments to Communications, Outreach & Engagement or if additional funding may be needed.*

Recent Developments on ASP Matters

- Following the Consultation Call, the GAC confirmed its support for the proposed path forward as discussed during the Board-GAC Consultation call, and shared a [letter](#) with the ICANN Board on 16 October 2024 outlining its understanding.
- In the letter, the GAC shared its support for remedial options shared by the Board as follows:
- For Advice item 1.a.i (ASP Applicants) the GAC understands that:
 - ✓ The monthly reporting on geographic distribution can inform quarterly adjustments to the ASP Communications, Outreach & Engagement efforts.
 - ✓ The Board will direct ICANN org to share results of geographic distribution with the IRT after 20 qualified ASP applicants to:
 - determine adjustments to Communications, Outreach & Engagement to target applications from developing countries and
 - determine if additional funding may be needed.

Recent Developments on ASP Matters

- Regarding advice item 1.a.ii (ASP Evaluation Process):
 - ✓ the GAC understands that the Request for Proposal (RFP) process to select an independent third-party evaluator is underway and that ICANN org will select a vendor with appropriate evaluation skills and diverse experience to conduct a fair and objective assessment of globally diverse ASP applicants, taking into consideration the GAC's expressed position on ensuring that the ASP facilitates global diversification of the new gTLD program.

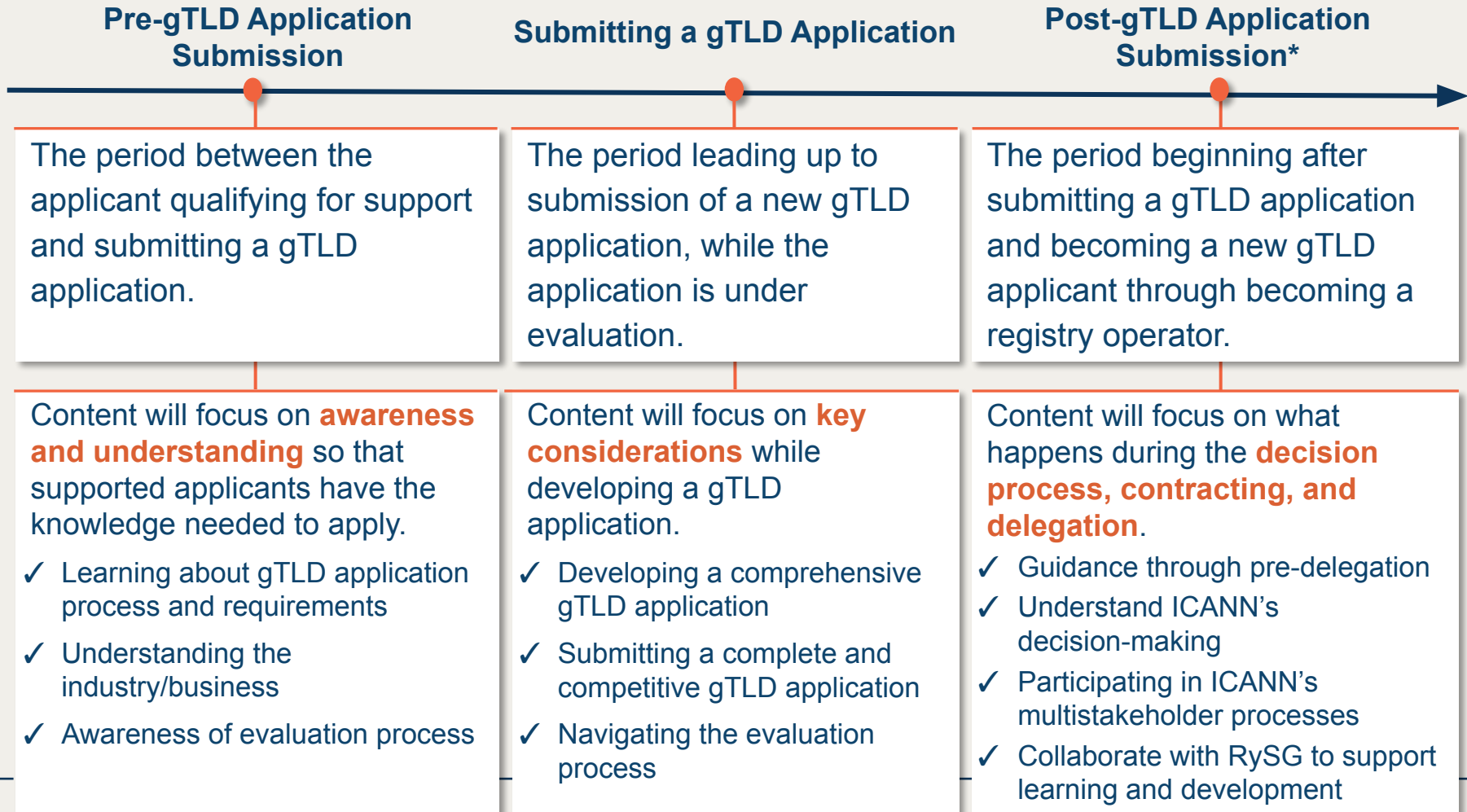

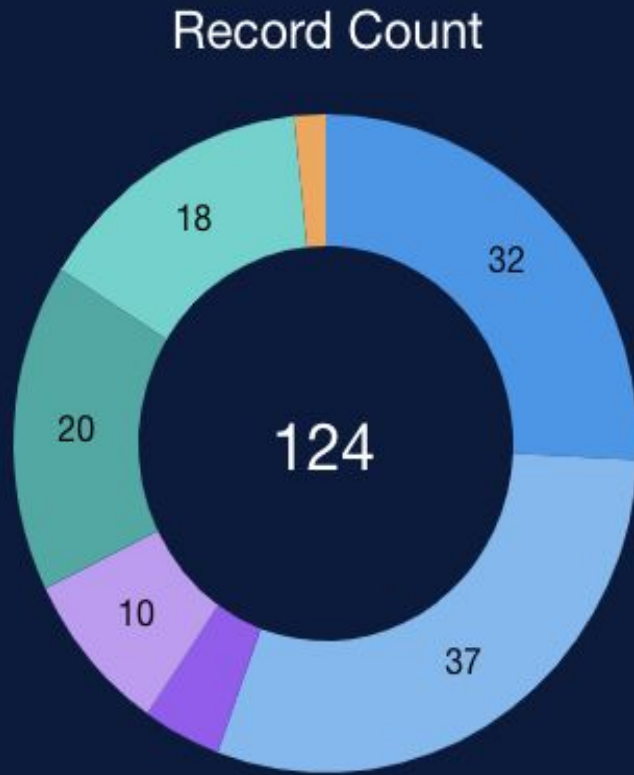

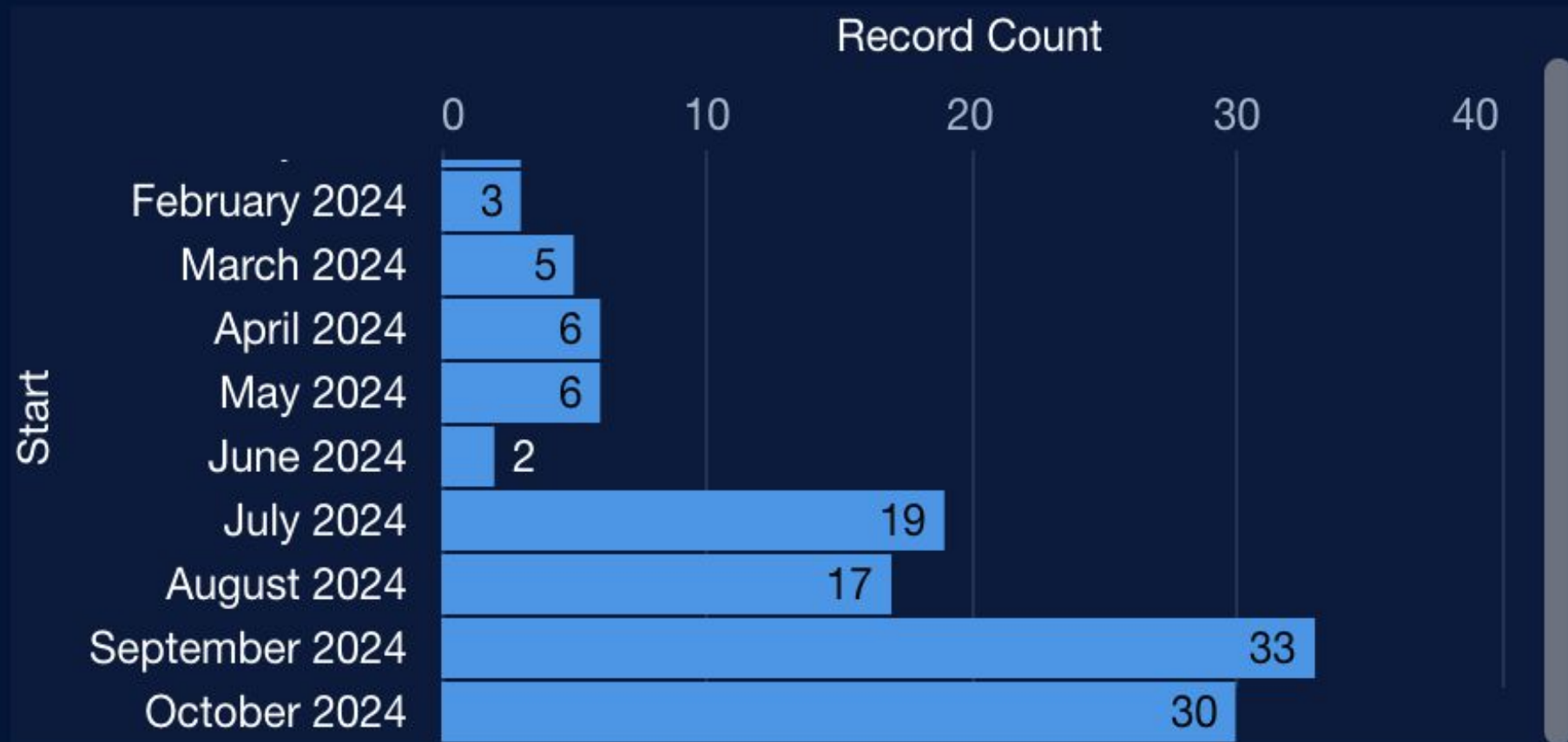

Capacity development, communications, and outreach with a focus on global inclusivity are key to fostering diverse participation in the next round of new gTLDs.

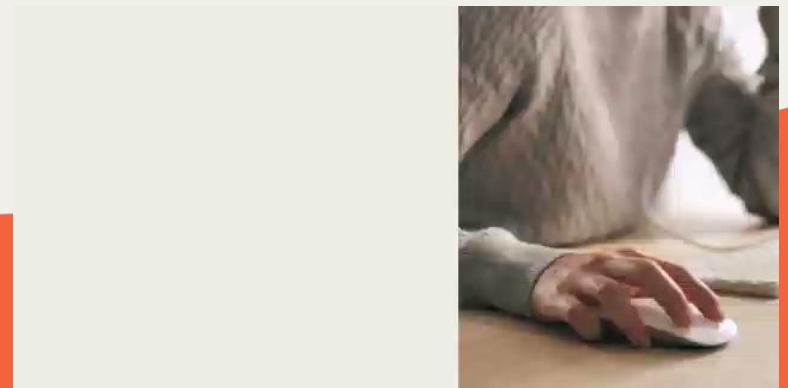
- ICANN is creating traditional media and social media campaigns for two phases:

- The global campaign to generate global Next Round awareness is in development and set to begin in January 2025.

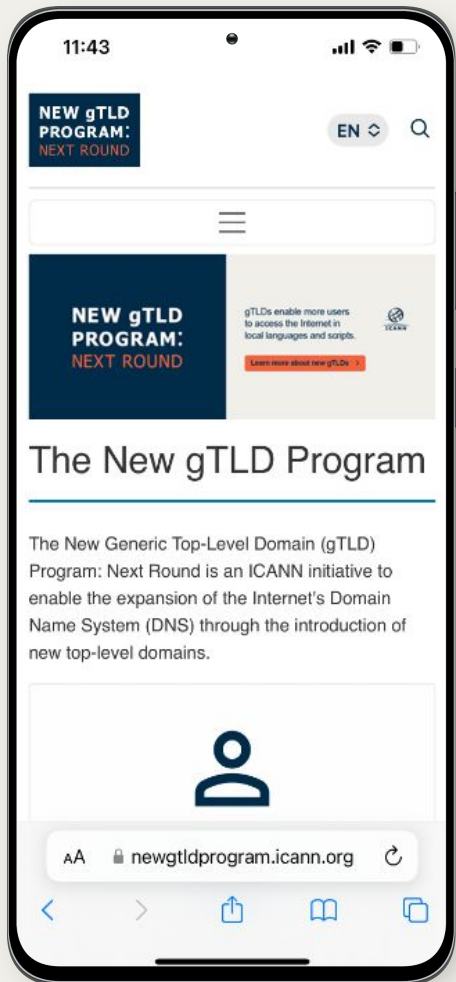
ASP Media Campaign Strategy

- Focus efforts in seven target countries: Brazil, India, Kenya, Mexico, Nigeria, South Africa, Türkiye.
 - Countries were chosen based on input from ICANN's GSE team and the successful UA-IDN media campaigns.
- A bespoke plan and strategy has been designed for each country that aims to educate local media, increase visibility of ICANN's initiatives, and drive engagement among potential applicants to the ASP.

ASP Paid Social Media Campaigns

- To complement the media outreach campaigns, ICANN is conducting paid social media campaigns targeted at potential ASP applicants in each country.
- Each paid post includes messaging tailored to one of the four main ASP-eligible audiences in each country: IGOs, Indigenous/Tribal Peoples' organizations, small businesses, and nonprofits/charities.
