Program Status Overview

Overall Program Status – As of 30 September 2025


The overall program continues in yellow status due to the risk of the overall program timeline given schedule delays on the GAP project recognizing its critical nature to the opening of the application window. The GAP project continues positive progress on system and process development work. The RST project went live on 30 July and has moved to yellow status as the team continues to resolve system bugs. The Post Contracting Project continues to be at risk (red) status due delays in hiring for the project leadership roles, which are now in

GAC Early Warning Process

Background

- As reviewed in Prague and in preparation for the ICANN84 GAC Sessions on the next round of new gTLDs and GAC readiness, an important element which needs to be developed by the GAC is a process for the submission of Early Warnings.
- This is a deliverable attached to the GAC and which is needed as soon as feasible to continue preparing GAC members for the next round, specifically about the role of the GAC.
- Since ICANN83, GAC Topic Leads and GAC Leadership have worked with staff to prepare a draft for GAC membership consideration and input.
- This was shared with GAC Membership via the mailing list in early October 2025 for review.
- Input has been provided by GAC members directly in the document.
