# Urgent Requests for Disclosure of Registration Data Timeline for Response

# Urgent Requests For Disclosure of Registration Data - Background

- Stems from ICANN Board-approved EPDP Phase 1 Policy Recommendation 18 (15 May 2019)
- In the policy implementation process (2019-2023) **agreeing on a timeline for response to Urgent Requests for disclosure of registration data** in “*circumstances that pose an imminent threat to life, serious bodily injury, critical infrastructure, or child exploitation*” **proved unattainable**
- Following Public Policy Issues raised by the GAC in a [letter to the ICANN Board](#) (23 Aug. 2023), the ICANN Board “*concluded that it is necessary to revisit Policy Recommendation 18 concerning urgent requests.*”
- In the [ICANN79 GAC San Juan Communiqué](#) (11 March 2024), the GAC Advised the ICANN Board “*To act expeditiously to establish a clear process and a timeline for the delivery of a policy on Urgent Requests [...] to respond to the vital public safety interests related to such requests. [...].*”
- Following discussions between the GAC, the ICANN Board and the GNSO Council, all parties agreed to proceed in two parallel tracks [proposed by the GAC](#) (15 October 2024):
  - **An Authentication Track** to explore possible mechanisms to authenticate law enforcement requestors
  - **A Policy Track** to determine an appropriate response time for authenticated Urgent Requests, assuming an authentication mechanism is in place

# Urgent Requests For Disclosure of Registration Data - Current Status

- Following discussions in the Registration Data Implementation Review Team (IRT) which resumed after ICANN83 in April 2025 (“Policy Track”), the GAC provided [Comments \(15 December 2025\)](#) in an [Public Comment proceeding](#) regarding ICANN’s proposed Consensus Policy Language, seeking finalization of the process, and confirming:
  - **24 hours response timeline** in the absence of exceptional circumstances (force majeure)
  - **To become enforceable upon availability of LEA Authentication mechanisms, without requiring additional policy development**
- Discussion with and between the GNSO Council and the ICANN Board during ICANN85 have clarified next steps towards enforceability of this timeline for response to Urgent Requests
  - On the timeline: the ICANN Board indicated to the GNSO Council its **support for finalizing and proceeding with the 24 hours timeline for response to Urgent Requests** (publication as ICANN Consensus Policy). The GNSO Council signaled to the GAC that there was **general agreement in the GNSO to do so**.
  - On Authentication: **the Board expressed preference** for the GNSO Council to provide guidance that this is an implementation detail. **The GNSO Council indicated that it was leaning towards the alternative option** of providing supplemental policy recommendations on this matter as part of the expected SSAD supplemental policy recommendations.

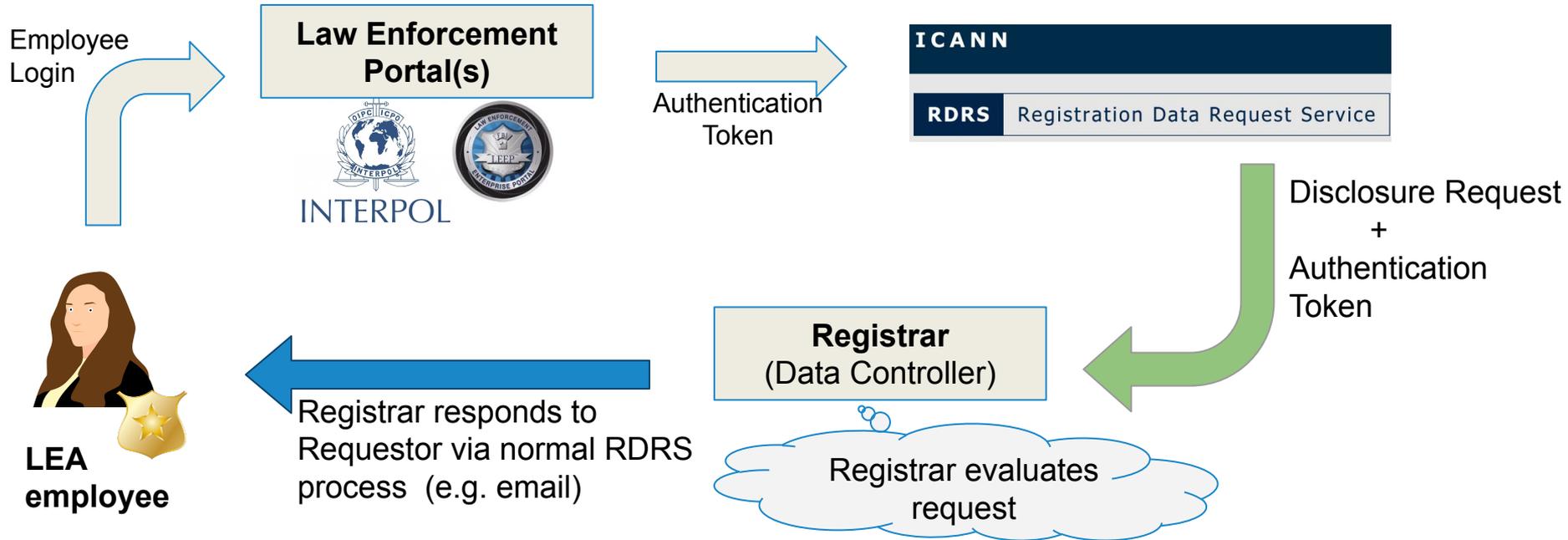

## Background

- In February 2025, following agreement among GAC, ICANN Board and GNSO Council, **the PSWG convened a Practitioners Group** with representatives from the GAC, the GNSO and several law enforcement agencies (including Interpol, Europol and the FBI) **to discuss the feasibility of Law Enforcement Authentication Mechanisms** to enable Contracted Parties to respond swiftly to Urgent Requests.
- During ICANN84 in Dublin, the ICANN Board [resolved](#) (30 October 2025) to encourage *“the ICANN President and CEO, or his designee(s), to continue to collaborate with the GAC PSWG on possible law enforcement authentication mechanisms.”*
- **Feasibility discussions** among the Practitioners Group and with ICANN org **have focused on a Short Term and a Long Term Authentication Mechanism**

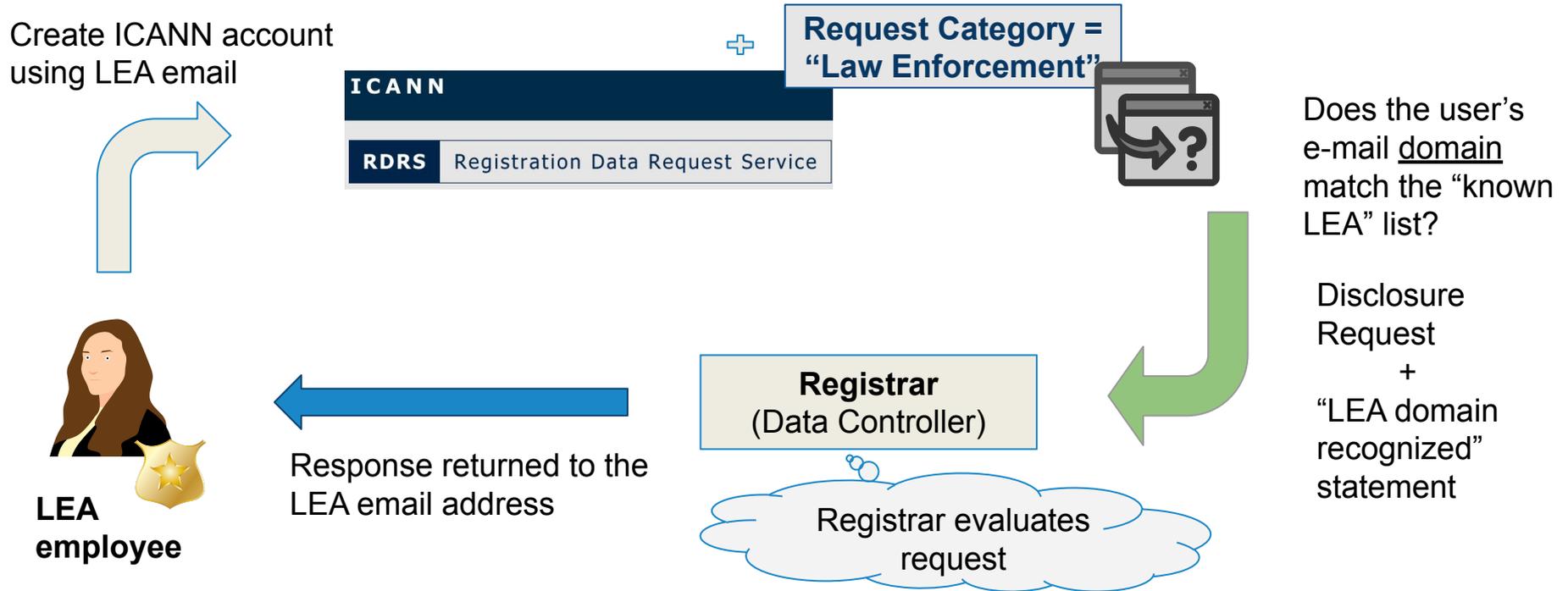
# Authenticating Law Enforcement Requests: “Long Term”

# Next Steps on RDRS and SSAD Policy Recommendations

## Recent Developments

- During ICANN84 in Dublin the ICANN Board [resolved](#) (30 October 2026) to **continue operations of the RDRS for up to 2 years** “*while the community continues its deliberations regarding the future of the service and related policy recommendations*”
- The GNSO Council and ICANN Board have been discussing **next steps on SSAD recommendations** as reflected in a recent [GNSO Council letter](#) (2 March 2026):
  - The ICANN Board is expected to non-adopt the pending SSAD recommendations, triggering the provisions of ICANN [Bylaws Annex A](#), Section 9
  - This will enable the **GNSO Council to provide Supplemental Recommendations** which would improve the SSAD Recommendations, which it intends to deliver “*within months, not years*”
  - The [Findings of the RDRS Standing Committee](#) (10 Nov. 2025) are expected to serve as a basis
- During ICANN85, the GNSO Council will hold a [Session](#) to discuss these next steps on Thursday 12 March at 9:00am in Room 206 A/B

# SSAD Next Steps for the GAC

---

- The GAC expects that ICANN's Advisory Committees will be involved in the drafting of SSAD Supplemental Recommendations
- The GAC will continue to bring public policy perspectives on the establishment of a permanent System for Access and Disclosure of Registration Data (SSAD) consistent with:
  - The [GAC Minority Statement](#) (24 August 2020) on the EPDP Phase 2 Recommendations
  - The [GAC Comments](#) (29 Sep. 2025) on the [RDRS Standing Committee Report](#)
  - The [GAC Comments](#) (15 Dec. 2025) on ICANN's [Policy Alignment Analysis](#)

# GAC Goals Regarding RDRS and SSAD

---

- The GAC has consistently stressed:
  - **The importance to enhance the RDRS** while it continues to be in operation, including:
    - Better integration for registrars' systems and requestors' systems with the request portal
    - User experience improvements to reduce user friction
  - The importance of achieving the **shared vision with the ICANN Board of an RDRS or Successor System** that would provide:
    - Mandatory registrar participation
    - A requirement for registrars with affiliated privacy and proxy services to also respond to RDRS requests for underlying privacy/proxy customer contact data as part of their disclosure decision process
    - RDRS links in RDAP responses to promote awareness
    - Option for country code top-level domains (ccTLDs) to voluntarily participate in the RDRS
