Community Input, Objections, and Appeals



Overview [4]

Starting on String Confirmation Day, the community will have the opportunity to provide input as follows:

- The general public will have the opportunity to submit application comments
- GAC members can decide to issue GAC Member Early Warnings
- The GAC may issue GAC Consensus Advice
- The general public will have the chance to submit singular/plural notifications
- Parties with standing will be able to file objections, the determinations of which can be appealed



Application Comments [4.1]

ACF opens on String Confirmation Day and stays open for duration of Program
Comments submitted within 104 days after String
Confirmation Day and within 30 days of specific
Application Change Requests will be available to evaluators for consideration

- Mechanism for the public to bring relevant information and issues to the attention of ICANN, applicants, and evaluators regarding specific applications
- Do not have a direct impact on applications but may be taken into account by the relevant evaluators if submitted during the specified time frames
- Public* and posted on an ICANN-managed platform—the Application Comment Forum (ACF)
- Do not have costs associated
- Applicants may respond to comments

^{*}unless they refer to confidential portions of an application



GAC Consensus Advice [4.3]

- Issued by the GAC according to ICANN's Bylaws
- Must include a rationale
- Intended to address applications that are identified to be problematic
- Applicants may respond within a specified time frame
- If accepted by the ICANN Board, may prevent an application from proceeding, or from proceeding unless specific modifications are made



Singular/Plural Notification [4.4]

- Submitted by the general public
- Based on claim that an applied-for string is the singular or plural form of another applied-for string, a delegated TLD, a string being processed from a previous new gTLD round, or a blocked name
- Must include evidence
- Does not have costs associated
- If a match is found, the relevant string(s) may be placed in a contention set or the application prevented from proceeding



Objections and Appeals [4.5]

- Filed by parties with standing
- On specific grounds
- Administered by external Dispute Resolution Service Providers
- Have costs associated
- An Independent Objector may file Limited Public Interest and Community Objections given certain conditions
- If the objector prevails, the relevant string(s) may be placed in a contention set, or the application prevented from proceeding or may only proceed with specific modifications
- The expert determination can be appealed



GAC Member Early Warnings [4.2]

- Issued by individual or groups of GAC members
- Provide the applicant with an indication that the application is seen as potentially sensitive or problematic
- Do not have a direct impact on the application but may signal the likelihood that the application could be the subject of GAC Consensus Advice or of an objection
- Must include a written explanation describing why the Early Warning was submitted and how the applicant may address the GAC member's concerns
- Applicants are encouraged to communicate with relevant GAC member(s)
