DOMAIN NAME SYSTEM


FIRST, THERE WAS THE ARPANET

- HOSTS.TXT
 - Single File
 - Downloaded By All
 - Bandwidth Issues (NIC)
- Flat Namespace
 - Inflexible
 - Did not Scale

THEN CAME THE DNS

- Domain Name System
 - P Mockapetris
- Design Goals
 - Consistent Name Space
 - Distributed
 - Extensible
 - Work for Multiple Applications
 - Independent of Underlying Carrier
 - ...


DOMAIN NAME SPACE



DESIGN ELEMENTS OF THE DNS

- Components
 - Domain Name Space
 - Resource Records
 - Name Servers
 - Resolvers
- Interactions
 - Users with applications
 - Applications query (local) Resolvers
 - Resolvers query Name Servers (Caches)
 - Name Servers keep Zones (Resource Records)

ZONES



ZONES

- Zone Files
 - Specify Resource Records
 - SOA, A, AAAA, MX, RRSIG
- Zones (Zone Files) can be
 - Primary (original (or master) copy)
 - Text file (database generated)
 - Secondary ((slave) copies)
 - Text file (transferred)
- Data Distribution
 - Preplanned Pushes (Zones)
 - Random Pulls (Queries)

WHAT'S IN A (DOMAIN) NAME?

"The **domain name** of a node is the list of the labels on the path from the node to the root of the tree." RFC 1034


"In the Domain Name System (DNS) naming of computers there is a hierarchy of names. The root of (!) system is unnamed. There are (!) a set of what are called "top-level domain names" (TLDs)." RFC 1591

"A domain name is an identification string that defines a realm of administrative autonomy, authority or control within the Internet." Wikipedia

- Generic Top Level Domains
 - gTLDs
- Purpose based
- Finite Number
- Process
 - Contractual relationship with ICANN
 - Compliance
 - Recourse
 - Independent Review Process (IRP)



 - ccTLDs
- Geography based
 - Not as easy as one thinks...
- Process (developed over time)
 - RFC 1591
 - · Framework of Interpretation
- ccNSO
 - · Policy binding on members

TERMINOLOGY IS IMPORTANTTM

- Adding a ccTLD to the Root
 - Delegation
 - Process
- Change of ccTLD Manager
 - Transfer (Agreed)
 - Process
 - Revocation & Delegation
 - Substantial Misconduct
 - Process?
- Removal of a ccTLD from the Root
 - Retirement
 - This PDP

TERMINOLOGY IS IMPORTANTTM

- ccTLD Manager
 - Should reside in-country
 - Obvious Reasons
 - Entity (or Individual)
- Admin(istrative) Contact
 - · Must reside in-country
 - Historic Reasons (RFC 1591)
 - Individual or Role Account

ISO

ISO

- International Organization for Standardization
- List of Country Names obtained from the UN
 - Country Name
 - "Name of a country, dependency, or other area of particular geopolitical interest"
- ISO 3166-1 (International Standard)
 - "Codes for the representation of names of countries and their subdivisions"
- Country Code
 - "List of country names with their representations by code elements"
 - Alpha-2
 - Alpha-3
 - Numeric
- Currently under way
 - ISO/DIS 3166-1 (Draft International Standard)

ALPHA-2 CODE ELEMENTS

- AA-ZZ
- Or rather
 - AB QL, RA WZ, & YA ZY[©]
 - Upper case
- Within ISO 3166-1
 - Country Names
 - 245 corresponding ccTLDs
 - No ccTLDs
 - .BL, .BQ, .EH, .MF, and .UM
- Outside of ISO 3166-1
 - Exceptionally Reserved (currently 12)
 - Current ccTLDs
 - .AC, .UK, .EU and .SU

RETIREMENT

EXTERNAL EVENT EXAMPLES

- Country Changes Name
 - Timor East Timor (TP TL)
- Country Seizes to Exist
 - Unification
 - Germany (DE DD)
 - Country Splits Up
 - Netherlands Antilles (AN CW, SX, BQ)
 - Exceptionally Reserved (SU)
- Independence (Split Off)
 - Southern Sudan (SS)
 - Sudan (SD)

RETIREMENT SCENARIOS

- One-to-One Name Change
 - .TL added to the Root
 - .TP retired
- Retirement Proper
 - .CW added to the Root
 - .SX added to the Root
 - .AN retired
 - .BQ not added to the Root
- Exceptionally Reserved
 - .SU remained in the Root

ISO Trigger Events

- ccTLD is eligible
 - ISO Alpha-2 Code Element assigned
 - In rare (exceptional) cases
- ccTLD will be retired
 - ISO Alpha-2 Code Element removed
 - In rare cases

RETIREMENT (POLICY) STEPS

- ISO *Trigger Event*
- Decision to Retire ccTLD (IFO/ICANN?)
 - ccTLD Manager informed (IFO)
- Retirement Plan
 - drafted (ccTLD Manager)
 - agreed (ccTLD Manager IFO)
 - implemented (ccTLD Manager)
- ccTLD Removal from Root
 - Removal Date (IFO)
 - Final Approval (ICANN)

RETIREMENT PLAN

- Not Mandatory
 - · Unless time extension requested
- Agreed Between
 - ccTLD Manager
 - IFO
- Communications Plan?
- ...

RETIREMENT MILESTONES

- ccTLD stops accepting
 - Registrations
 - Renewals
 - Transfers

exceeding the Removal Date

- ccTLD Manager turns off Register
 - Registrar Access
 - DNS Updates

COMPLICATIONS

OUT OF SCOPE

- Decision to Retire
- Removal from Root
- ccNSO Membership
 - Or lack thereof
- Registrants
 - Purpose based Registrations
- Registrars
 - Business Model
- ...

UNEXPECTED CONSEQUENCES

- ccTLD Manager Change
 - Transfer
 - Significantly Interested Parties?
- ccTLD Manager Non-Functional
 - Revocation & Delegation?
 - ccEBERO?
 - Within of Scope of PDP?
- ccTLD Manager Uncooperative
 - Functional
 - Out of Scope of PDP

EXCEPTIONALLY RESERVED

- No Policy for Adding to Root
 - Board Guideline (EU/.EU)
- Move from Exceptionally Reserved to ISO
 - AC/.AC is the only current candidate
 - previously GG, JE, IM
 - .GG, .JE, .IM remained unchanged
- Exceptionally Reserved to Formerly Used
 - Retirement
 - Process Unclear
 - Probably Case-by-Case
 - Spirit of (this) Retirement Policy?
 - ...

IDN ccTLDs

- Internationalized Domain Names
 - Not in the ISO Standard
- Removed from ISO 3166-1
 - Probably trigger for IDN Retirement
- ISO Name Change
 - IDN (Name) Change?
 - · Who decides?
- ccNSO PDP on IDN
 - Will deal with Trigger Event(s)

IDN HYPOTHETICAL

- Country Name Changes
 - Republic of Xubuntu
 - Federal Republic of Xubuntu
- ISO 3166-1 Standard
 - XR would be removed
 - XF would be added
- ccTLD
 - .XR would be retired
 - .XF would be added to the root
- IDN
 - What would happen to . >> * CACHA!?
