UA Day Overview

Universal Acceptance (UA) is a technical requirement that ensures all valid domain names and email addresses, regardless of language, script, or character length, can be equally used by all Internet-enabled applications, devices, and systems.

UA Day is an opportunity to rally local, regional, and global communities and organizations to spread UA awareness and encourage UA adoption with key stakeholders. Following the earlier success of UA Day in 2023 and 2024, UA Day 2025 further expanded UA awareness and the importance of its adoption.

UA Day events were held with support from regional and local organizations, the Universal Acceptance Steering Group (UASG), global partners, and the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN). In addition, ICANN and UNESCO joined forces to champion UA for UA Day 2025, with UNESCO's national representatives participating in various UA Day events, including the main UA Day 2025 event in Hanoi. These events aimed to engage the technical and language communities, companies, governments, and Domain Name System (DNS) industry stakeholders to better understand the benefits of UA and encourage them to make their systems UA-ready.

Call for UA Day 2025 Proposals

ICANN and the UASG **announced** a **call for UA Day event proposals** to support the following event types:

UA Awareness

Provide a high-level overview of UA and Email Address Internationalization (EAI), the benefits of being UA-ready, basic technical concepts related to UA, and next steps for becoming UA-ready.

UA Technical Training

Provide in-depth training on becoming EAI-ready for email system administrators and on becoming UA-ready for software developers.

UA Academic Curricula

Work with academic faculty members and experts to integrate Internationalized Domain Names (IDN) and UA-related topics into existing technical curricula and design a roadmap.

UA Adoption

Conduct a UA adoption exercise and share challenges and solutions to becoming UA-ready.

UA Regional Strategy

Discuss appropriate mechanisms for promoting UA adoption at the local, national, and regional levels.

UA Day Event Proposals and Shortlist

A total of 110 proposals were received for UA Day 2025 from 62 countries or territories. A proposal review team was constituted with nominees from UNESCO and the ICANN community, including the UASG, At-large Advisory Committee (ALAC), and country code Names Supporting Organization (ccNSO). The review team finalized the criteria and shortlisted 58 proposals from 58 countries or territories. In total, 59 UA Day events were organized across 55 countries and territories in 2025, due to some shortlisted events not proceeding, and separate UA Day events that were held. Of these events, 19 events were organized by <u>At-Large Structures</u> (10 AF, 3 APAC, 6 LAC), 10 were organized with the collaboration of country code top-level domains (ccTLDs) managers, and four were organized by <u>gTLD</u> registry operators.

UA Day 2025 Keystone Event

The keystone UA Day event was held in Hanoi, Viet Nam, on 8 May 2025, co-located with the Contracted Parties Summit and APAC DNS Forum. Tripti Sinha, ICANN Board Chair, and Truong Giang Nguyen, Vietnam Internet Network Information Center Deputy Director General, officially launched UA Day 2025 event, providing opening remarks about the importance of UA in digital inclusion. This was followed by a plenary session and two parallel sessions focusing on IDNs and UA. Speakers from diverse stakeholder groups highlighted the challenges, solutions, and progress on UA adoption.

UA Day Events by Region





Figure 1: Distribution of UA Day 2025 Events Organized Across Different Regions

Thirty-four percent of the UA Day events were held in the Asia-Pacific (APAC) region, 29 percent were held in Africa, and 25 percent were held in the Latin America and Caribbean (LAC) region. There were fewer events in Europe and North America (NA), as shown in **Figure 1**.

UA Day Events by Date

UA Day events were organized over a three-month period from March through May, with the majority of events occurring on or around 28 March 2025. A few events were held around Internet Day on 17 May 2025, as shown in **Figure 2**. The figure also illustrates that the organizers use the flexibility provided in organizing UA Day, with 22 events held in March, 15 events held in April and 22 events held in May 2025.



UA Day Events by Location

UA Day events were held in 55 countries and territories: 18 in Asia Pacific, 17 in Africa, 14 in Latin America and the Caribbean, four in Europe and two in North America. Though regional events included representatives from multiple countries, only a host country is listed below. Therefore, participants from more countries participated online.

UA Day Events by Type


The 59 UA Day events were distributed across the various types of events as per **Figure 3** below. The detailed breakdown per type and region is provided in **Table 2** below.

Of the 59 events, 23 were focused on UA adoption and 13 on technical training. In addition, 11 events were held on UA awareness and six events each on academic curricula and regional strategy.

UA Day Adoption Events

UA Day adoption events were also organized in 2025. Some featured technically simple changes that introduced their audience to new possibilities, while others involved more advanced solutions. Some examples include:

- iMasters, in Brazil, demonstrated <u>how to set up a Wordpress site</u> using Brazilian characters in the domain name and paths.
- FUNDETIC, in Plurinational State of Bolivia, showed a bilingual (Spanish/Aymara) website for a local community: (uñtañanicharaña.gtic.gob.bo).
- The Federation of Computer Association Nepal showcased a website (https://क्यान.संगठन) in Nepali for a local organization, with all the text and links in Nepali. The website supports and uses internationalized email addresses.
- The Thai Network Information Center Foundation, in Thailand, showed a UA-ready demo ecommerce site: https://เว็บไทย.ไทย.

Adoption events not only built technical capacity, but illustrated real-world applications, encouraging others to be UA-ready. In many cases, the local language email is being introduced for the first time in these communities. Together with domain names in local languages, these events have a direct impact on creating more meaningful access for local communities.

UA Day Event Materials and Publications

To support UA Day event organizers and manage consistent messaging, a variety of materials were developed, including awareness and technical training presentations, graphics, and videos. The materials were also translated and made available in Arabic, Chinese, French, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish languages. 

UA Day Participants

UA Day events were able to create significant awareness around the world and featured a total of 7,695 participants across the globe in 2025. A total of 35 percent of participants were from the APAC region, 33 percent from Africa, 28 percent from the LAC region, 2 percent each from Europe and North America. The distribution of participants across regions is shown in **Figure 4**.



These participants represented many different stakeholders, including:

- Businesses
- Governments and telecom regulators
- Civil society and non-government organizations, including At-Large Structures and Internet Society chapters
- Intergovernmental organizations
- IT companies and technology startups
- The DNS industry
- Internet service providers and hosting providers
- · Academia, including faculty and students

UA Day Events by Language

UA Day events were held in more than 23 languages, including Arabic, Armenian, Bangla, Burmese, Chinese, English, Filipino, French, Galician, Haitian Creole, Hindi, Kiswahili, Lao, Marathi, Nepali, Portuguese, Russian, Sesotho, Sinhala, Spanish, Thai, Tongan, and Urdu.

UA Day Communications and Photos Coverage

ICANN conducted comprehensive communications outreach to spread UA Day awareness and encourage participation. Key communications included:

UA Day events were also promoted on ICANN and UASG social media platforms, and by event organizers from their social channels.

UA Days 2023-2025: At a Glance






Figure 6: UA Day Events Held Across the Different Regions from 2023-25

From 2023 through 2025, UA Day has grown into a significant global effort, bringing together technical communities, governments, and businesses to work toward a more inclusive and multilingual internet. A total of 167 UA Day events have been held across 82 countries or territories in 39 languages between 2023 and 2025. Figures below demonstrate the trend over the past years. **Figure 5** shows how these were distributed across the different years, and **Figure 6** shows a further breakdown by the five different regions.


UA Days 2023-2025: At a Glance (continued)

A total of 23,663 participants have attended the UA Day events over the past three years. Figure 7 shows the number of participants who attended these events per region across these years, with 9,424 participants in 2023, 6,544 participants in 2024, and 7,695 participants in 2025. Finally, Figure 8 shows that all the different types of events were supported over the past three years, with UA Awareness and UA Technical Training events the two most popular categories.
