ICANN84 | AGM – GAC Opening Plenary Saturday, October 25, 2025 – 9:00 to 10:00 IST

GULTEN TEPE

Hello, welcome to ICANN84 GAC Open Plenary session on Saturday 25th of October at 00:08 UTC. Please note that this session is being recorded and is governed by ICANN Community Participant Code of Conduct, ICANN Expected Standard of Behavior, and the ICANN Community Anti-Harassment Policy.

During this session, questions or comments will only be read aloud if submitted in the proper form in the Zoom chat. Interpretation for this session will include all six UN language and Portuguese. If you like to speak during this session, please your hand via Zoom room.

Please state your name for the record and the language you'll be speaking when speaking a language other than English. And please speak at a reasonable pace to allow for accurate interpretation. Now, I'll hand the floor over to GAC Chair, Nicolas Caballero. Over to you, Nico.

NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you so much, Gulten. Welcome, everyone, esteem GAC colleagues, and honor guests. It is with a profound honor and deep appreciation that I welcome you to the opening ceremony, the opening plenary of the ICANN84 meeting in the beautiful city and beautiful and historically of Dublin as we gather here today.

Note: The following is the output resulting from transcribing an audio file into a word/text document. By the way, a decade after ICANN last convened, here we are reminded of Ireland's timeless legacy as a crucible of resilience, innovation, and global dialogue. Dublin is a city where ancient traditions intertwine with modern digital dynamism, and it has long been a beacon of cultural and intellectual brilliance.

We stand on the shoulders of giants who shaped not only Ireland's destiny, but also the course of human progress, let me say. So, let's draw inspiration from historical figures like Jonathan Swift, the satirical visionary and author of Guliver's Travels, one of my favorites when I was a kid, by the way, who's sharp wit challenged the status quo and championed justice.

I can also mention Constance Markievicz, a revolutionary leader, and the first woman, by the way, elected to the British Parliament whose courage redefined equality in politics, or James Joyce, a literary pioneer whose masterpieces like Ulysses transformed modern literature and celebrated the human spirit in all its complexity.

Let me also mention Oscar Fingal of Flaherty Wheels Wild, also known as Oscar Wild. Born in Westland Road, correct me if I'm wrong, right here in Dublin on October 16th, 1854, who I guess needs no introduction. So, their legacy somehow echo our own mission just to forge a digital future rooted in creativity, inclusivity, and unwavering principle. So, as we mark ICANN's return to Dublin after 10 years, we confront a pivotal moment for the domain name system.



Our agenda this week will be addressing critical frontiers, demand collective wisdom and satisfaction like the next round of gTLDs. I don't need to get into details. But there, we basically must balance innovation on the one hand with robust safeguards or guardrails on the other hand.

We'll also be dealing with DNS abuse, mitigation, ensuring the security and integrity of the Internet's infrastructure. WHOIS registration data reforms, basically harmonizing transparency with privacy imperatives. And we'll also allocate time for the GAC strategic planning, basically refining our governance to meet evolving global challenges.

And of course, there are many other topics as per the block schedule already circulated to all the distinguished GAC representatives. So, these discussions are not married technical, they're foundational to a trusted, open, and equitable internet for all.

I would like to extend my deepest gratitude to the Irish government, our gracious hosts, and Mr. Ian Price, Ireland's GAC representative for their exceptional hospitality. So, your dedication embodies the warmth and collaborative spirit of this nation. So thank you so much for that, Ian.

So to all my distinguished GAC colleagues joining us in person or online, let me just tell you, your expertise and commitment are invaluable. Together, let's seize this opportunity to advance



policies that reflect our shared vision for a digital world anchored in stability, innovation, and public interest above all.

So, welcome to Dublin everyone, let our dialogue here ignite progress for the next decade and beyond. Thank you so much. Now, let me give the floor to our distinguished colleague from Ireland, Ian Price, the floor is yours.

IAN PRICE

Thanks, Nico, and thanks for being able to cover much more Irish history effectively and quickly than I probably could. So, thank you for that. So, good morning, everyone here in Dublin and good morning, afternoon and evening esteemed GAC colleagues wherever you are, if you're online, it's a delight to welcome you here to the convention center in Dublin. It's an honor for us to welcome you here, but I think it's first a right to just express the sympathies with colleagues Noman who put tireless work to host this event. We hope that we can do justice to the work you put into that. We're fortunate that ICANN managed to find a home in Dublin so quickly, and it's truly an honor to be able to host a meeting you this magnitude here.

We'd also like to thank the host organization INEX, who stepped in at the last minute and have put a huge amount of work with ICANN to organize the meeting. It's a landmark year for internet governance, both globally and here in Ireland, and that makes it even more special that ICANN have decided to host their AGM here.

PREP WEEK

It's one of their official stops on the WSIS+20 proprietary process roadmap, which really shows that ICANN is such an early forum for vital discussions. Here in Ireland, we're delighted to have our first national internet government forum earlier this year. Moving forward, such fascinating and important discussions and creating dialogues between stakeholders from all areas of society, truly in the vein of the multi-stakeholder model of internet governance, of which ICANN is a superb example.

And on a personal level, I would like to be here for my first public meeting, having just joined the area about six months ago, so, I'll try and leave you with a traditional Irish phrase of, Céad Míle Fáilte, or a hundred thousand welcomes. We hope you have a fantastic engaging and interesting time here in Dublin with us. Thank you. Thanks, Nico.

NICO CABALLERO

Thank you very much, Ian. If we can move to the next slide, please, Gulten. So, this is just a quick review of the session agenda. After the welcoming speech, we'll be reviewing some meeting logistics. And then right after that we'll have the table or however you pronounce that, in-person and then for remote GAC participants. And then we'll talk about some notable GAC transitions and activity highlights, including elections and some other important topics of course. And then if time permits, we'll have a short review of the GAC communique development process. Not sure we'll actually



get there given the fact that the table usually takes some time, but we'll see how it goes.

Next slide please, Gulten. So, before we go ahead with the introductions and the table, there are some notable agenda highlights I would like to mention at this point. As everybody knows, this is an AGM, an Annual General Meeting, that's in terms of the meeting format. As I said during my welcoming speech, we'll be talking mainly about the next the new gTLD neck round issues, DNS abuse, registration, data accuracy, and many other specific topics.

We'll also not only talk about the GAC strategic and annual plan, but also endorsing them if possible today, again, depending on the time, but we have allocated enough time, so that should be okay. We'll also talk about the RORs or Review of Reviews, yet another acronym for the ICANN ecosystem. Not only with the GAC, but also with the full ICANN community, as you will probably have seen.

And then in terms of bilateral meetings with other constituencies, we'll have a meeting, of course, with the ICANN Board, with the ASO, ALAC, ccNSO, GNSO, NCSG, which stands for Non-Commercial Stakeholder Group. I don't think I need to translate to English all the acronyms at this point, and also the SSAC.

Also, we'll have a very interesting discussion and conversation. As a matter of fact, we have a visit by the WSIS+20 team, the cofacilitators are gonna be with us today as well. And then again, as I said, if time permits, we'll allocate some time to the communique



drafting and some other very interesting evening networking events.

Next slide, please, Gulten. Let's take a look at the GAC block schedule. I don't need to get into details here because on the one hand, we already had two agenda setting calls with the full GAC, and on the other hand, the block schedule was circulated beforehand, like I would say 10 or 15 days ago. So, everybody should be familiar with the schedule at this point, but just for you to get a broader view of the week ahead. So, let me stop here in order to see if we have questions or anything before we go ahead with some meeting logistics for which I will give the floor to ICANN staff, sorry GAC staff.

But before I do that, is everything okay, any comments or questions regarding the block schedule or the agenda topics? This is a good time to say anything if there's anything to say. I don't see any hand up. Thank you so much. So, next slide, please, Gulten. So, in terms of meeting logistics, I don't know if you want me to go ahead with this Rob or if you will go ahead. It's a pleasure to see you all because I have seen many familiar faces from previous meetings and I would like to thank the country, the government of Ireland to receive us in this beautiful city with a very good weather, even though it's a bit cold, but the sun is shining. So, I'm really very interested in following all the meetings we are going to have here, as well, the advances that we have made in our action plan. So, I'm available to you all. Thank you very much.

IAN PRICE

Good morning. My name's Ian Sheldon, I'm the Australian GAC representative. Just wanted to thank my gracious Ireland government hosts for welcoming us here in this lovely city and very much looking forward to a productive and collegiate meeting with



you all here across the week. Thanks. So, Ian Price from the Irish government department of Cultural Communications and Sport. Lucky to have you all here with us. I'm looking forward to working with you and other members of the team here who will introduce themselves as we go around. Thank you.

NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you, Ian. So I'll go ahead in Spanish as well, given the fact that Spanish is my native tongue. So, I would like to thank once again the government of Ireland, to Ian and his team for the hospitality, for the benefit of the new 32 delegate state of GAC. My name is Nico Caballero, so I'm the GAC Chair. I was reelected. I'm not convinced that you did a good election, but I was reelected as a matter of fact, in Prague, the meeting in June for another term.

So I would like to welcome you all, and I agree with what my colleague from Columbia has said, it's quite a cold weather because we are coming from warmer weather. But anyway, I would like to welcome you all and myself and the vice chair are available to you whenever you would like to have a word with us during coffee breaks or in the isle at lunch. So, you may come to us and we'll find some solution to any problem that you may have. Thank you very much.

Morning, everyone. I'm Pearl Risberg, I am also from NTIA and supporting the team.



NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you so much, USA. The row right behind you, can you

continue there on the left?

AMINA RAMALLAN

Good morning, everyone. My name is Amina Ramallan. I'm part of the GAC representatives for Nigeria. I work for the Nigerian Communications Commission, which is the telecoms regulatory body in Nigeria. Thank you.

IBISO KINGSLEY-GEORGE

Good morning, everyone. My name is Ibiso Kingsley-George from the Nigerian Communications Commission. I'm Amina's colleague, and we're here to represent our country. Thank you.

KLAUS PARRER

Good morning, everyone. My name is Klaus Parrer, I'm the GAC representative of the Republic of Austria. I work as the head of department responsible for telecommunications and internet issues in the ministry responsible for telecommunications. And I'm happy to be back in Dublin and looking forward to productive meeting. Thank you.



CHINA

Good morning, everyone. My name's [00:39:14 - inaudible], I'm the GAC representative of China. I'm with the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology of China. It's great to be here. Thank you.

CHINA

Good morning, Chair. Good morning, everyone. I'm also a Chinese GAC representative of China. I'm glad to attend the meeting and thank Irish government for holding the wonderful meeting. Thank you.

CHINA

Hello, everyone. My name is [00:39:44 - inaudible]. I come from China. I'm affiliated with the China Internet Network information Center. Thank you.

ABOUBAKRY KANE

Good morning, everyone. My name is Aboubakry Kane from Senegal and I'm representing the Regulatory Authority of Telecommunication and Post, where I serve as head of emerging technology and strategic watch. So, I'm really interested in the following all the meeting we're going to have. Happy to be in this wonderful city of Dublin. Thank you.

ABDALMONEM GALILA

Yes, this is Abdalmonem Galila. I am the GAC alternative representative for Egypt. I am working for the National Telecom Regulatory Authority of Egypt as Director of Numbering Affairs.



This is my second time here in Dublin. Thank you very much for the Irish government and for ICANN to select such a beautiful city of Ireland, Dublin. Thank you.

ANTOINE BARBRY

Hello, everyone. Antoine Barbry, I represent the international French speaking organization. I am based in Geneva. I would like to congratulate ICANN for all of its efforts towards multilingual meetings, especially during this tour de table. I would like to thank Jorge for being the first one to express himself in a different language. Thank you.

TOMONORI MIYAMOTO

Morning, everyone. My name is Tomonori Miyamoto from the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications, Japan. And I thank the Irish government for hosting this meeting, and I look forward to having a productive week, and also I look forward to enjoying this city. Thank you.

JAPAN

Good morning, everyone. This is [00:42:03 - inaudible] from Japan. This is my first ICANN meeting. I'm looking forward to the week. Thank you.

INAKI GIL OSES

Good morning, everybody. I will speak in Spanish. Hello, I'm Iñaki Gil, representative of Spain at GAC and I work in the Ministry of



Digital Transition. It's my first ICANN meeting, so I'm willing to understand the dynamics and to collaborate in the work of the committee as much as possible.

KEN-YING TSENG

Good morning, everyone. My name is Ken-Ying Tseng, I'm GAC representative Chinese Taipei. Happy to meet all friends and new friends once again at GAC meetings.

WENG-FONG TSEN

Good morning, everyone. My name is Wen-Fong Tsen, and I'm the GAC representative from Chinese Taipei. Glad to be here for the first time and thank the Irish government for hosting this meeting. Thank you.

NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you so much, Chinese Tapei. Is there anybody behind you that belongs to the GAC? I saw Tracy. Oh, there you go. Go ahead. Just grab a microphone and introduce yourself, please.

KRISTINA HAKOBYAN

Good morning, everyone. My name is Kristina Hakobyan and I'm an advisor to Armenia representation. And wish everybody a productive meeting. Thank you very much.



NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you very much, Kristina. Anybody else in the room that didn't have the chance to introduce himself or herself so far? I saw Tracy Hackshaw from the UPU walking around, but I don't see him anymore. So, all right, thank you very much. We'll continue with the introductions online. Let's go ahead with Gloria from Uganda. Please go ahead.

KATUUKU GLORIA

Morning everyone. I'm happy to be joining you online. My name is Katuuku Gloria. I'm the GAC representative for Uganda, and I would like to take the opportunity to serve as one of the GAC Vice chairs, it's an honor, and I'm looking forward to learning as I joined the team that has been before me. Thank you very much.

NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you, Gloria. Yuriy, please go ahead. The floor is yours.

YURIY MATSYK

Morning, colleagues. My name is Yuriy Matsyk, Director General of Broadband Infrastructure Development of the Ministry of Digital Transformational, Ukraine. I'm leading our national broadband and resilience initiatives, making sure Ukraine's internet stays connected under any conditions. It's a pleasure to join the GAC and contribute to the discussion on connectivity, security, and future proof internet governance. Thank you.



NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you very much. Next, I have the Russian Federation.

VIACHESLAV EROKHIN

Good morning, colleagues. My name is Viacheslav Erokhin. I am alternative GAC representative of Russian Federation. I'm working for Russian research center in the field of ICT and we support Russian Ministry of Digital Development, Communication, and Mass Media with technical expertise, consultancy, as well as support of participation in international organization. Thank you.

NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you very much Russian Federation. I have Niger next.

KAMMIRI SOUROUMPO

Hello, everyone. I am Kammiri Souroumpo. I work with the presidency and I represent Niger at the GAC. Thank you.

NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you so much. Anybody in the room who didn't have the chance to introduce himself or herself? Nobody. Okay, I don't see anybody else online, Gulten, unless you tell me. Otherwise, we can-okay. Thank you so much. So, we'll move ahead with the-- we still have 10 minutes. So, let me refer to-- right after the tour de table.

Some notable GAC transitions, as I said before, we're welcoming 32, as a matter of fact, yeah, new GAC delegates since ICANN83 back in Prague. That's a lot. 32 new representatives. Welcome,

welcome everyone. That makes up 184 GAC members and 41 observers.

Just a quick reminder as well, please, do join the mailing list, and you have the address right there on the screen, it's gac@icann.org, sorry, joingac@icann.org, where basically we have already developed a new ticketed ticketing system for updates and other housekeeping details. So, please remember to do that.

And by the way, let me also thank you, give a big thanks to the incoming GAC vice chairs. Their new terms will begin after ICANN85 in Mumbai, India in March next year. But they were not elected, but acclaimed, I would say, as of today. And they are Ian Sheldon from Australia, Ian to my right, this is Ian Sheldon from Australia, and this is for the benefit of the new GAC representatives.

Zeina Bou Harb, would you please stand up so that people can see you? Thank you so much. Zeina from Lebanon. Marco Hogewoning from the Netherlands to my left. Then we have Jorge Cancio from Switzerland, also to my left. And Gloria Katuuku from Uganda. Is she in the room? Ah, she was online. I'm sorry. So, a big welcome.

Thank you so much. Thank you for stepping forward, really appreciated and needed, by the way. So, they will be officially seated, as I said before, right after ICANN85 in Mumbai. Next slide, please, Gulten. So, for this activity highlights, I don't know, Rob, if you would like to go ahead with the details or you want me to go,



I'm okay either way, but you're more than welcome to provide some recent deck activity highlights if you would like to go ahead.

ROBERT HOGGARTH

Thank you. Thank you, Nico. The slide speaks for itself, so please, all enjoy reading it and reveling in the success of the last period. A tremendous amount of work and contributions from the GAC leadership as well as many of you within the committee and working groups. So, thanks very much for that.

Nico, I think in terms of time available for this session, and given several new members joining for this meeting, maybe the last five minutes, you and Fabien do a very quick review of, well, just a heads up, if you will, of the communique process here over the next few days. Thank you.

NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you so much for that, Rob. You actually read my mind. And I see Tracy now. Tracy, you forgot to introduce yourself, but everybody knows you, so, we're okay. This is Tracy Hackshaw from the UPU for the record. So, we still have five minutes, and for that, next slide, please, Gulten. We'd like to quickly review the communique development so that everybody-- so we're on the same page basically, again, especially for the new GAC representatives. And for that, I will give the floor to Fabien Betremieux. Fabien, the floor is yours.

FABIEN BETREMIEUX

Thank you, Mr. Chair. So, my name is Fabien Betremieux from the GAG support team. Given that there are a few newcomers, I think it's worthy of going through this explanation. We only have four minutes, so I will stick to very high-level information and we can delve into the process a bit more when we meet again regarding the communique on Tuesday at the end of the day. So, what's important to know is what the communique is, the GAC communique.

The GAC communique is one of the key output of a GAC meeting. And it's a document in which the GAC reflects its deliberation, its engagement with other ICANN community group, internal GAC activities, and also where the GAC states it's issues of importance. And so, what the GAC believes is important to know on the priority issues for the GAC and the priority issues and policy issues at ICANN.

And it also includes GAC consensus advice to the ICANN Board if the committee determines that it is needed. This is consistent with provision in the ICANN bylaws that are specific to the GAC, which call for the possibility for the GAC to issue consensus advice that the Board must consider and potentially engage with the GAC about, should there be concerns with that advice.

And so, we'll refer to the bylaws more specifically when we talk about this. And so, this is not in the output of a GAC meeting. It's a key output. Another document that you may be interested to be aware and review after a meeting is the GAC meeting minutes



where GAC support team records the substance of the GAC deliberation.

So, the communique does not include all those deliberations, that's the purpose of the minutes. The communique reports specifically on the most important aspects of the deliberations in addition to statements on issues of importance and potential GAC consensus advice. What you see on the screen is the entire process of communique development, which has three phases. Communique preparation phase, before the meeting, communique drafting phase, during the meeting, and communique review period, after the meeting.

And I guess I'll leave you with this key message, which is that during the meeting, it's already started before the meeting, but the communique document is open for your consideration and potential input. What we request is that as GAC member, you engage potentially with GAC topic leads on issues that you believe need to be reflected in the communique so that we facilitate early discussion of issues among GAC members before we get to communique drafting.

And that's in the interest of an effective and efficient communique drafting process and all those sessions and ensure that we complete communique drafting in the time we have allocated for it. I'll just mention in closing that there are a few topics that have already been identified for potential statements as issues of importance. And you may see that in the draft communique.



And I will send you an email right away, which has the link to the communique, so, please pay attention to that. So, among those issues, there are currently Applicant Support Program Implementation and outreach as one of the topics for issues of importance, early warning procedure for the next round of new gTLDs, and I believe there's also ongoing discussions of registration data in DNS abuse.

These are usual topics that feature in the communique. And topic leads on those two last issues are currently collaborating to share potentially some consideration, initial consideration for the communique. And with that, I'll just stop here and we will talk about this again in more details on Monday at the end of the day. Thank you.

NICOLAS CABALLERO

Thank you so much for that Fabien, very detailed explanation. We'll have time to talk about that as well during the next session, the strategic planning session, which will come right after the coffee break. By the way, we'll have a coffee break right now from 10:00 AM to 10 30, and I'm sure there's very good coffee in Dublin, that's for sure. I already got some good tea.

So, in terms of housekeeping, the rest of the day, we'll be discussing from 10:30 to 12:00, as I said before, the GAC strategic planning, then we'll have a lunch break. And then we'll start with two of the capacity building sessions, session number one and session number two, I don't need to get into the details. You have



them on the block schedule. And then, the very last session of the day at 4:30 PM will be our discussion on new gTLDs next round, the first of two sessions.

So, before we close at this point, Ian, or any of my distinguished vice chairs, do you have any closing remarks? Anything you would like to mention at this point? The floor is yours in case you want to do so. No. All good. Okay, so thank you so much. Enjoy coffee. We'll reconvene at 10:30. Thank you so much.
